DG Sam's Official Visit to the club on 13.01.07



DG Sam on his official Visit to the club emphasized on the fact that on how an effective rotary club should work cohesively along with its senior and new members. Some of the positives from his speech and his suggestions included:

- 20 % growth in membership over last year after retaining 100 % of the members
- Average age of less than 40 years
- Superb documentation and presentation at the Club Assembly
- Maintaining the 100 % PHF club status
- Paul Harris Society member (Narender Gauri - USD 1000 commitment for 10 years)
- 12 fellowships (Including IFCR) in the last 6 months
- Interact club already existing, but should also start a Rotaract Club
- Surprised that a movie program can generate funds to the tune of Rs. 3.00 lakhs
- Wanted us to apply for the PR fund and use it effectively
- One of the few new clubs that meet regularly and keep proper records
- One of the few clubs who had many joint meets with other rotary clubs.
- Per capita contribution of about USD 125 to the Rotary Foundation which might end at about USD 150 by the end of the term against a commitment of USD 50.
- 100 % registration for the District Conference (would be happy if we had some Golden and Silver Patrons and Anns)
- Dedicated community service including in the Pulse Polio program (stress should be given for Matching Grant Projects)
- Excellent PR work while the president was traveling abroad and hosting Rotarians and GSE team while on their visit to India

Most importantly the governor thought that the club had done exceedingly well in three main aspects that he deemed essential: Growth of the club, Contribution to Rotary International / Foundation and Participation in the District Conference. He also noted the maximum representation from other clubs of the district portraying the excellent PR of the club.

Asst. Governor Suresh Khemani also noted that the club had all the past presidents who are very active and noted the extremely good attendance at all the meetings he had the opportunity of attending. He also inducted a new member, Mr. Tumul Rathi, who is just 26 years old and the youngest member of the club.

Games were organized after the meeting, which were enthusiastically participated by all the Rotarian members, Anns and also the visiting Rotarians. This was just before the dinner fellowship. The entire day's proceedings were very kindly hosted by Rotarians Subhash Dhandania, Pavan Tibrewal and Vaman Rao.

Community Service Visit to Krysto Ashram on 20.01.07



Krysto's Ashram is running a school for orphans/destitute students. Hostel facility (Boarding & Lodging) is also provided for all students in a separate building close to school, which is run from the church premises. This organization was established in Nov'1992 with 2 students and at present takes care of about 42 children. The organization is taking care of street children, abandoned children and children of prostitutes. The organization is aiming to start separate hostel for handicapped children.

Some members of our club, i.e., Rtn.Ramayya, Rtn.Subhash, Rtn.Sarathy, Rtn.George, Rtn.Amarnath, Rtn.Kailash Gupta led by our President Rtn.Rajesh visited the ashram and distributed shoes to all students. Kitchen items, utensils, eating plates, glasses (all stainless steel) costing Rs.7000/- were also donated to the school authorities. The club assured them of further assistance for mattresses, fans etc. Rtn.Ramayya, Director community services spoke to the children and advised them to inculcate habit of helpfulness to others. Principles of Rotary and 4-way truth were also explained to children. Mr. Ravindra Nair, founder of this orphanage thanked the RCSS profusely.
