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Mega IOL Surgery Project Completed !

The importance of eye as one of the most essential sense organ of our human body is felt by us only when we lose sight of it, Yes literally, imagine finding your way around your house or in a crowded marketplace blindfolded. The travails and trauma of such an experience will not only make us fully alive to the cruel realities of the life, which hundreds of our fellow blind brethren lead but also ensure to rededicate ourselves as Rotarians to "Lend a helping hand" to the needy to preserve one of the greatest gifts the almighty has give us, SIGHT.

Rotary Club of Secunderabad Sunrise (with support from RI Dist 3150) has taken up the wonderful project of helping the poor and needy by conducting the eye camps for IOL surgeries at the villages bordering the outskirts of the twin cities. Screening was done on more than 600 patients and 100 patients detected with cataract were implanted with IOL. The patients were mainly from interior places of Nalgonda dist - Peddagandhakur, Medchal, Shameerpet, Chinagan-dhakur, Kacharam, Mallapuram, Yadagiripally and kallakal.

This laudable community service project taken up by our club during the current year 2005-06 in liaison with wonderful support extended by Sadhura Eye Hospital, was ably led by Rtn. Dr. Kailash Gupta (Director - Community Service) with unstinted support from fellow rotarians notably Rtn. Ravindranath, Rtn. KRP Sarathy,

Rtn. Ramayya, Rtn. Chandrasekhar, Rtn. Narender and Rtn. Vaman. Rtn. Kailash Gupta worked relentlessly through the year with active support of Mr. A. N. Gupta (MD), Mr. Sudhakar and the staff of their company M/s Premier Explosives and Premier Mushroom Farms particularly when the camps were conducted in the villages in close proximity to these companies.

Rtn Ravindernath and Rtn Chandrasekhar also chipped in by conducting camps at several villages with the help of their local work force. Thus working with full enthusiasm and zeal the Team Sunrise has reached the target of 100 IOL surgeries by April 2006, which is very creditable achievement indeed, of course with Lion hearted support from Sadhura Eye Hospital.



The sarpanches of the respective villages have cooperated fully in making the camps a grand success. Now there is a demand from the adjoining villages for Rotary Service. Let us continue this good work by conducting these camps in more villages and helping many more people with the surgeries.

The gratitude the patients have expressed has really touched our hearts. During such moments you feel proud to be a Rotarian "Lending your hand" to the needy.

Assistant governors work with the governor-elect and other members of the district leadership team to establish district goals with club leadership teams to establish club goals. District goals are developed at the district team-training seminar, where assistant governors and district committee members work with the governor-elect. My responsibilities during the year in office include:

- Visiting each club regularly to meet with the club president and the board to discuss the business of the club.
- Assisting in scheduling and planning the Governor's official visit.
- Attending each club assembly associated with the governor's official visit.
- Keeping the District Governor updated on club activities including redressal of any problems.
- Monitoring each club's progress towards its annual goals for membership, club administration, service projects and support to the Rotary Foundation

I have been assigned five clubs to monitor including my home club and all the clubs have performed admirably in most of the avenues of service if not in all. Meaningful interactions with the leadership of my assigned clubs has been a motivating and enriching experience leading to not only a better understanding of club performance but also throwing up challenges which the clubs have effectively overcome. The initial hesitation of having an Assistant Governor visit the club, supposedly to monitor the club, has given way to free and frank discussions to achieve club and Rotary goals.

Madhu -You are viewed as a very committed Rotarian. Who is your inspiration?

Dr. Kailash - The trait of helping people in some way or the other comes naturally to me. In fact this is a trait that runs in our family. As early as 1950, my grandfather started a School in Chandigarh for Girls. Even today, the Motiram Arya Girls High School is well known and is being run by the family trust. My father Late Dr.C.K.Gupta is my biggest source of inspiration. He was a man who believed in simple living and high thinking, ever willing to lend a helping hand to those in need.

Madhu - What triggered your interest in taking up the course on Maternal health and family welfare?

Dr. Kailash - I could not pursue my MD because my husband's profession involved a lot of travel both within and outside India. I always believed that age was no barrier to acquiring knowledge or increasing one's level of awareness. The course is very useful in my practice as I come across young parents who are eager to learn the nuances of parenthood and family health in general.

Madhu - Please tell us something about the IOL and Bone density camps conducted by the Rotary Club of Secunderabad Sunrise?

Dr. Kailash - Well, the IOL and Bone density camps have been one of the most satisfying experiences in my life. We conducted around seven health camps and more than a hundred people were treated. We have covered all the details of our health camps in our club bulletin for the benefit of our members. The happiness and joy on the faces of the beneficiaries have to be seen to be believed!

Madhu - You are into personal counseling. Have there been instances of people having benefitted from counseling?

Dr. Kailash - Of course! In fact I have the satisfaction of having saved a few people from committing suicide. Counseling helps people overcome their apprehensions, have faith in themselves and gives them the courage and confidence to face life and its challenges.

Madhu - What is the role of your family in your endeavors?

Dr. Kailash - My family is my strength. My husband and daughter have been very supportive of all my ideas and they have constantly encouraged me to involve myself in my profession as well as service projects because they believe that only a happy mother can ensure a happy family. I owe a lot to my family.

Madhu - What are your hobbies and interests?

Dr. Kailash - Well, my profession is also my hobby because I love my job as much as I love my other hobbies, which include reading, walking and meeting people. I also conduct awareness lectures in Army MI Rooms for general health and family planning.

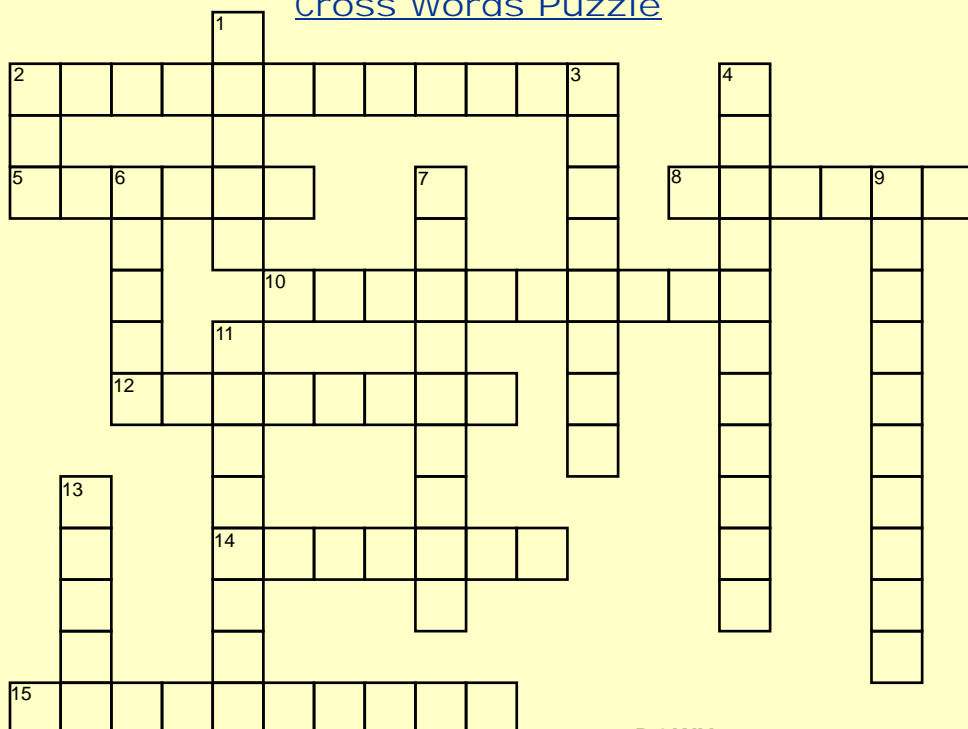
THE LAW OF GIVING
