ROTARY - INTERNATIONAL



January is finally here. As we look forward to 2021, our thinking doesn't have to stop at the end of these 365 days. Are you thinking ahead about what you will be doing in 2022, 2023, and beyond?

We cannot foresee the future, but we can steer ourselves where we want to go. I think it is important that every Rotary club hold a strategic meeting at least once a year. Past RI Director Greg Yank, who has a lot of experience working with clubs on their plans, shares his viewpoint.

A famous aphorism states, "By failing to prepare, you are preparing to fail." Planning is essential to achieving success in all areas of life, including Rotary, and we're getting better at it every year.

Strategic planning for Rotary clubs works. I have helped many clubs find that pathway by working with them to build what I call a blueprint, a multiyear plan that answers the fundamental question: "What is our vision for our club?" The best plans I have seen are those that are focused, when a club concentrates its resources on the best opportunities it has. Your Rotary club cannot be all things to its members and to the community it serves; it has limited human, financial, and time resources. A successful plan factors in assets and limitations to chart the desired pathway for your members.

Begin building a multiyear strategic plan by brainstorming with your club, asking, "What are our initiatives and priorities for the next two to three years?" Document your answers using action-oriented language that is specific, concrete, and measurable about the goals you want to achieve.

Next, narrow down your initiatives to a core set of three to five priorities. Your club will then develop specific objectives for each initiative, outlining who will be involved, key milestones of achievement, how progress will be tracked, and a timeline for completion. Keep your plan short and simple.

Then go out and do it. Review the progress you make toward accomplishing the initiatives, and revise as needed at least once a year. Rotary has a solid template to assist clubs in their planning, which you can find at my.rotary.org/en/document/strategic-planning-guide.

We want to enrich and enliven our clubs with new discussions and ideas. But how do we attract the diverse professionals, from different backgrounds, ages, and experiences, who are all driven by as strong a sense of integrity as we are?

Through strategic planning, we explore this question to define the very nature of our club and the value it offers to its members and to the community. Each club is different, and each club's value will be unique. During the planning process, clubs may also find that some of the activities they used to do are no longer relevant or attractive.

Once your club makes a strategic plan, it's time to take action and carry out the necessary changes. When we do that — as we engage members in vibrant and active clubs that not only have fun but also serve their communities with projects that have real and lasting impact — our clubs grow stronger. And when we discover what makes our own clubs unique and build upon those core values in all our efforts, Rotary Opens Opportunities to enrich the lives of everyone.

Rotary Volunteers

You can find them working in remote clinics, refugee camps, makeshift hospitals, primitive villages, and their own communities. They are experts in administration, community development, education, food production, health care, and water and sanitation. They're Rotary Volunteers.

The Rotary Volunteers program encourages and facilitates volunteer service, putting Rotary's ideal of Service Above Self into action. The program is administered by Rotary Volunteers committees at the club, district, and international levels. Rotary Volunteers have shared their expertise in a multitude of humanitarian projects around the world.

Rotarians and non-Rotarians who wish to serve as international volunteers can register with RI World Headquarters and are included in the Rotary Volunteers Database at www.rotary.org. Resources for finding volunteer opportunities and special needs include the Rotary Volunteers International Site List Database and the Rotary Volunteers Resource List, both available at www.rotary.org. These tools can help volunteers locate their own projects and make arrangements directly with project coordinators.

Interact

Interact, a Rotary-sponsored youth service club, was launched by the RI Board of Directors in 1962. The first Interact club was established by the Rotary Club of Melbourne, Florida, USA. Interact clubs provide opportunities for young people of secondary school age to work together in a world fellowship of service and international understanding. The term "Interact" is derived from inter, for international, and act, for action. Every Interact club must be sponsored and supervised by a Rotary club and must plan annual projects of service to its school, to its community, and in the world.

In 2006, there were more than 10,500 Interact clubs with 242,000 members in 119 countries. Interactors develop skills in leadership and attain practical experience in conducting service projects, thereby learning the satisfaction that comes from serving others. A major goal of Interact is to

provide opportunities for young people to create greater understanding and goodwill with youth throughout the world.

Rotaract

Building on the success of Interact clubs in the early 1960s, the bRI Board created Rotaract in 1968. The new organization was designed to promote responsible citizenship and leadership potential in clubs of young men and women ages 18-30. The first Rotaract club was chartered by the Rotary Club of Charlotte North in Charlotte, North Carolina, USA. In 2006, there were 184,000 members in more than 8,000 Rotaract clubs in 139 countries.

Rotaract clubs emphasize the importance of individual responsibility as the basis of personal success and community involvement. Each club is required to complete at least two major service projects each year, one to serve the community and the other to promote international understanding.

Rotaract also provides opportunities leading to greater leadership and professional development. Rotaractors enjoy many social activities as well. A Rotaract club can exist only when sponsored, guided, and counseled by a Rotary club.

Still More Rotary Firsts

RI's General Secretary

The day-to-day operations of Rotary International's Secretariat are under the supervision of the general secretary, the top professional officer of Rotary. Although the general secretary is responsible to the RI Board and president, he provides the ongoing management for nearly 650 staff members who work at RI World Headquarters and the seven international offices.

The general secretary serves as secretary to the RI Board and is also the chief executive of The Rotary Foundation, under the supervision of the Foundation Trustees. He is the secretary of all Rotary committees as well as the Council on Legislation, regional conferences, and the annual RI Convention.

The general secretary is appointed by the RI Board for a term of not more than three years, which may be renewed by the Board for a term of up to five years. Since 1910, 10 men have served in that position. Chesley Perry, the original general secretary, served from 1910 to 1942. Others who followed were Phil Lovejoy (1942-52), George Means (1953-72), Harry Stewart (1972-78), Herb Pigman (1979-86 and 1993-95), Philip Lindsey (1986-90), Spencer Robinson Jr. (1990-93), Geoffrey Large (1995-97), and S. Aaron Hyatt (1997-2000). Ed Futa was appointed in 2000.

Throughout the history of Rotary, the personal influence and administrative skills of our general secretaries have significantly shaped the course of Rotary programs and activities.

Selecting a President

Each year, a distinguished Rotarian is selected as the worldwide president of Rotary International. The process begins one year in advance when a 17-person nominating committee is elected from separate zones of the world. To qualify for the nominating committee, a Rotarian must have served on the RI Board of Directors. If no past director from the zone is able to serve, a past trustee of The Rotary Foundation or a past district governor who has served on an RI committee may be appointed to the nominating committee.

The nominating committee may consider all past RI directors for candidacy. Members of the nominating committee and current directors are not eligible. Any Rotary club may suggest the name of a former RI director to the committee for consideration.

The committee convenes in September to select the Rotarian to be the presidential nominee, whose name is announced to all clubs. Any Rotary club may make an additional nomination before 1 December, which must then be endorsed by 1 percent of all the Rotary clubs of the world (about 320 clubs). If such an event occurs, an election is held by mail ballot. If no additional nomination is presented by the clubs, the person selected by the nominating committee is declared the president-nominee. At the international convention, the president-nominee is elected by voice vote and becomes the president-elect for the following year, which is spent preparing to serve the Rotarians of the world as the international president.

RITU'S COLUMN - HINDUISM HINDU DHARMA & UNCERTAINTY PRINCIPLE





The Jain philosophy says that nothing is absolute, everything is relative in the Universe. Hence, the Uncertainty is inbuilt in the Universe, both at macro (gross) level as well as micro (subtle) level.

At macro (gross) level, an event will be seen differently by observers in different frame of reference. In other words, an event will be seen differently by a stationary observer and a moving observer. e. g. (i) when a person in a moving train watches a tree, he finds it moving in a circle but a person who is standing stationary by the side of the train will see that tree stationary. It is because of the different frame of reference i. e. relative motion of the two observers. (ii) if two trains are moving closely and parallel to each other with different speeds, one slower and other much faster, an observer sitting in slower train will feel that other train is moving but with the difference of speed between two trains. However, the observer in the faster train will find slower train stationary.

It is again because of different frame of reference i. e. relative motion of the two observers. Hence, in Newtonian classical mechanics, the length (space), mass and time: the three fundamental units of physical Universe, which were considered absolute were found to be untrue in Einstein classical mechanics (special theory of relativity). The length (space), mass and time: the three fundamental units of physical Universe were found to be relative i. e. they change with an observer's frame of reference. A stationary observer and a moving observer will measure length or mass or time differently.



However, at micro (subtle) level the uncertainty becomes more profound. Let us suppose there are different observers in the same frame of reference (say stationary), watching an electron in a closed space. To some electron will appear as stationary, to some moving; to some inside closed space and to some outside the closed space; to some right side of the closed space and to some left side of the closed space; to some top side of the closed space and to some bottom side of the closed space; to some as a wave (diffuse electron cloud). So, they see the same event differently, even though in the same frame of reference. The Quantum mechanics explains this by postulating that at micro level, an observer changes the event observed. The different observer would change it differently and hence observed event will be different for each one of them, it will not be same.

Vedanta explains this by saying that each observer's consciousness is at different level of evolution and hence different. At micro level an observer's consciousness interacts with the consciousness of micro particle and for each observer this interaction will be different. Hence, they will see the event i. e. position or state of electron differently. Vedanta says that every object in the nature, whether animate or inanimate, has consciousness. When a person observes or interacts with another object, its consciousness interacts with the consciousness of that object. At macro level, the effect will not be noticeable but at micro level it will be significant. Vedanta also says, 'Vasudhaiva kutumbakam' i. e. whole Universe, whether animate or inanimate, is one family.

Everything in the manifested universe that we see differently, Matter and Energy (heat, light, sound, electricity & magnetism), are in fact one and the same. According to Einstein equation of mass energy equivalence, matter and energies which have different properties are one and the same. Our senses see apparent reality and not correct reality. Moreover, at the macro level, matter shows particle nature and energy shows wave nature. family, is definitely true.



But at micro level, the nature of both becomes dual i. e. matter (electron) shows wave nature also (De Broglie waves) and energy (electromagnetic waves) shows particle nature also (Einstein photons). Hence, reality is one which is perceived differently by our senses. Ultimately, there is only one particle (God particle) which is responsible for everything in the physical universe. Hence, whole universe is one family, is definitely true.

We, therefore, should have love and concern for everything, whether living or non-living and that is best way of living. We should be equally concerned with environmental pollution and preservation of nature, as with all living things. Our consciousness interacts with the consciousness of everything that we come in contact so we should not hurt anything. Hence, according to Vedanta, non-violence, whether with living or nonliving, is best creed.





Apple Crumble - RECIPE

FROM MY KITCHEN

Ingredients -7-8 juicy Apples - peeled & thinly sliced. Sprinkle a little lemon juice over them to prevent oxidisation. 1/2 cup Milkmaid2 Tbsp soft butter

Ingredients for the Crumble

1 cup maida
1/2 tsp cinnamon powder
1/4 tsp baking powder
1/3 cup powder sugar
1/3 cup cup cold butter cut into small cubes
1/2 tsp vanilla extract

Method to Make Crumble

1. Combine all the ingredients of the crumble and rub the butter lightly with finger tips till the mixture resembles bread crumbs.

Method to Make Apple Crumble

1. Preheat the oven to 180 C .

2. Mix milkmaid and butter together on low heat

for 3-4 mins till it is well combined. Keep aside to cool .

3. In a greased oven proof baking dish , placed the sliced apple in layers .

Press lightly & sprinkle little cinnamon powder between the apple layers.

- 4. Pour the milkmaid butter mixture over and spread evenly.
- 5. Top the apple slices with the crumble mixture.
- 6. Bake in the pre heated oven for 30 40 mins till the top crust is golden brown.
- 7. Serve warm with vanilla ice-cream.

Kala Jamun - RECIPE

Ingredients

- Soft Mawa (Khoa): 400 g
- Paneer: 125 g
- Suji (Semolina): 1 table spoon
- Baking Powder: 1/4 table spoon
- Maida: 75 g
- Sugar: 1 kg for sugar syrup
- Coarse Sugar: 2 table spoon for jamun
- Water: 500 ml
- Refined oil for frying: 500 ml
- Dry Fruits (Pistachios, Almonds, Cashews): handful approx.
- Cardamom Powder: 1/2 tea spoon
- Red Color (optional)

18-20 servings (2 pieces per serving)

Steps

Prep jamun dough

- Mash the khoa well with your hands and set aside. There should be no lumps or small bits in it.
- Grate paneer and set aside.
- Add maida to a bowl and add khoa and paneer from the previous steps to it. Gently mix it.
- Bring the mixture together to form a dough (do not kneed).

Prep jamun stuffing

- Dice the dry fruits and add to a cup.
- Add 2 table spoon coarse sugar and cardamom powder to it.
- Add 2 table spoon of the dough prepared earlier to the cup.
- Add pinch of red color as well (optional).
- Mix and keep aside.
- 1 string sugar syrup
- Add 500 ml of water to a vessel and add 1 kg sugar to it.
- Boil the solution on low flame until it becomes a 1 string sugar syrup.

Prep jamun

- Pinch a small lemon sized ball from the dough and roll it into a round shape.
- Make a finger sized hole half way though the ball.
- Add some of the jamun stuffing to it and close the hole.
- Roll the ball to give it an oblong cylindrical shape.

Fry jamun

- Heat oil on a low flame in a kadai.
- When the oil is hot enough, add jamun prepped earlier to the kadai.
- Fry till they turn slightly darker than the golden color.
- Remove the jamun from the kadai (make sure excess oil is drained) and add it to the sugar syrup.
