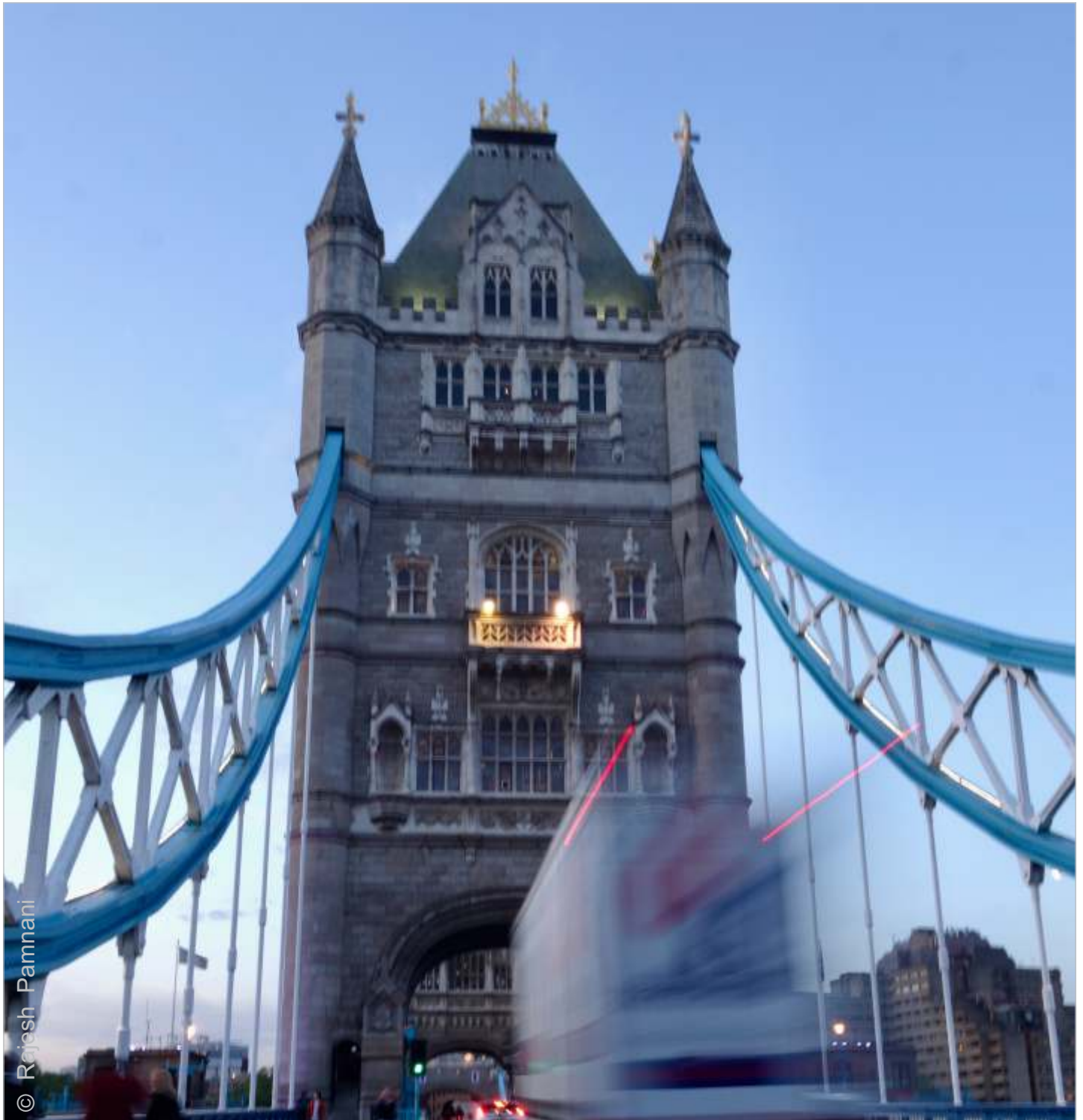

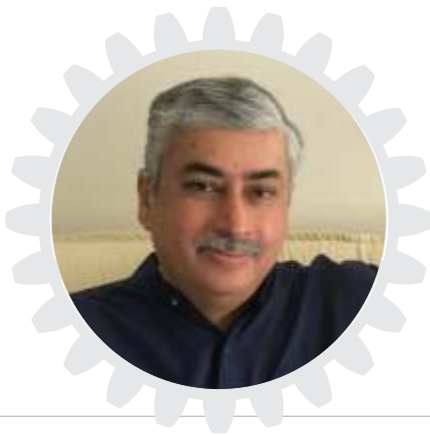

SERVICE PROJECT UPDATE

Project Brief on Old Age Home at Miyapur, Hyderabad

An Old Age Home / orphanage located at Miyapur, Hyderabad had approached Rotary Club of Secunderabad Sunrise for requirement of Toilets and a water trench to be constructed to arrest waterlogging at the Old Age Home.

To assess the actual requirements at the Old Age Home / orphanage, President Rtn Ravi Ladia and Rtn Srinivas Gumidelli have visited the OAH on 4th Oct 2021 and met the Incharge Ms Shaheen Afroze. She had informed that there are 60 inmates and personally shown the OAH/orphanage and explained about the problem of water logging during the rains and how the water is entering the buildings. The inmates also explained that during heavy rains, the water logging is a major problem and about 2-3 feet of water gets accumulated inside the buildings.

The other requirement of the OAH/orphanage was shortage of toilets and the inmates have to stand in queue for using the toilets.

Project Brief on Old Age Home at Miyapur, Hyderabad

To address these problems an architect and contractor were identified and they have visited the site to assess the needs and submitted a quote for the same. The estimation to address both these problems was to the tune of Rs. 8 Lakhs approx. We approached the RCSS Board for this requirement and Board suggested to approach our CSR partner BHEL GE Gas Turbines Services Pvt Ltd (BGGTS) for getting funds to execute these projects.

Subsequently we approached our CSR partner M/s BGGTS and explained the requirements of the OAH/orphanage along with quotation. M/s BGGTS was quite convinced about the project and gave approval to go ahead with the project and they committed to fund the project fully through their CSR funds.

M/s BGGTS have released 50% as advance to Rotary Sunrise Service Trust on 17th Jan 2022. On receipt of the advance amount, the Trust Chairman Rtn Rajesh Pamnani and Trust Treasurer Rtn Pawan Tibrewala have released the PO and advance to the vendor immediately. The work at the OAH/orphanage started on 27th Jan 2022. Some Pictures of the work in progress are shared.

Rotary 2022 International Convention to be held in Houston

The event will bring more than 20,000 participants from around the world and deliver \$30 million in local economic impact

HOUSTON (July 22, 2021) – During a joint news conference held at George R. Brown Convention Center today, Rotary and Houston First Corporation representatives announced that more than 20,000 service-minded people from around the world will gather in Houston for Rotary's 113th annual international convention on June 4-8, 2022.

The coveted international event is returning to Houston for the third time, marking the 50th anniversary of the 1972 international convention. The Bayou City also hosted the 5th Rotary convention in 1914. The event is expected to deliver \$30 million in economic impact for the city's hotels, restaurants, retailers and attractions.

"As a global membership organization that brings people from all continents and cultures together to share, learn and take action to bring positive and lasting change to communities around the world, we are thrilled that our first in-person international convention since 2019 will take place in Houston," said Rotary's International President Shekhar Mehta. "And for the first time ever, our annual event will be open to members of the public who want to connect, learn and be a part of our work to grow and change lives."

Rotary's 2022 international convention will transform the George R. Brown Convention Center into an energized hub and cultural mosaic as the organization's global network of volunteers gather to share information about all the ways they are taking action to address issues in their communities, to learn from notable experts, gain inspiration from world-class speakers, and connect with lifelong friends shaped through service.

Previous convention speakers include philanthropist Bill Gates; actor and philanthropist Ashton Kutcher; Prime Minister Justin Trudeau; actor, producer, host, entrepreneur, WWE Superstar and Rotary polio ambassador, John Cena; renowned primatologist Jane Goodall; and former United States Ambassador to the United Nations, Andrew Young.

Organized by Rotary International in conjunction with the Houston Host Organization Committee of local Rotary members, registrants of the convention will also experience Houston's hospitality with visits to local destinations like Space Center Houston, Kemah Boardwalk and one of Houston's premiere shopping destinations, The Galleria. 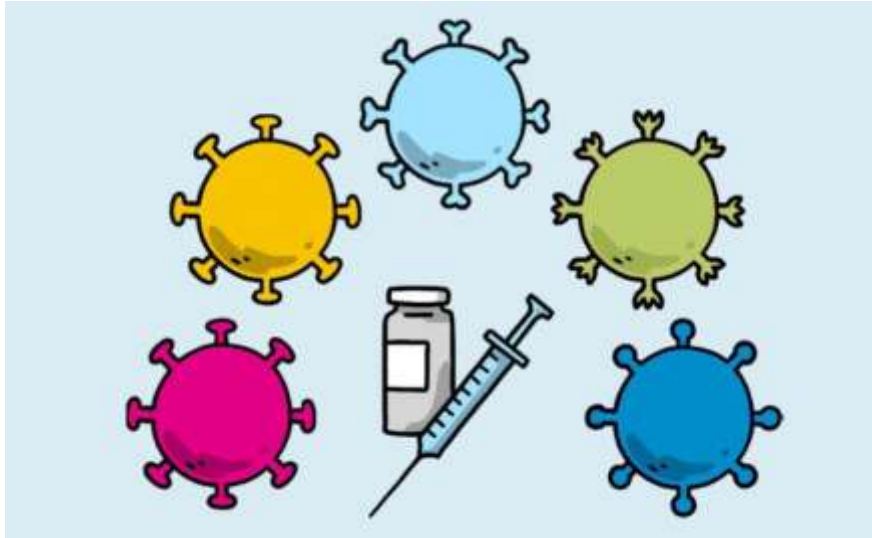

The effects of virus variants on COVID-19 vaccines

This article is part of a series of explainers on vaccine development and distribution. Learn more about vaccines – from how they work and how they’re made to ensuring safety and equitable access – in WHO’s Vaccines Explained series.

All viruses – including SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19 – evolve over time. When a virus replicates or makes copies of itself, it sometimes changes a little bit, which is normal for a virus. These changes are called “mutations”. A virus with one or more new mutations is referred to as a “variant” of the original virus.

What causes a virus to change to a new variant?

When a virus is widely circulating in a population and causing many infections, the likelihood of the virus mutating increases. The more opportunities a virus has to spread, the more it replicates – and the more opportunities it has to undergo changes.

Most viral mutations have little to no impact on the virus’s ability to cause infections and disease. But depending on where the changes are located in the virus’s genetic material, they may affect a virus’s properties, such as transmission (for example, it may spread more or less easily) or severity (for example, it may cause more or less severe disease).

What impact do the new variants of the COVID-19 virus have on vaccines?

The COVID-19 vaccines that are currently in development or have been approved are expected to provide at least some protection against new virus variants because these vaccines elicit a broad immune response involving a range of antibodies and cells. Therefore, changes or mutations in the virus should not make vaccines completely ineffective. In the event that any of these vaccines prove to be less effective against one or more variants, it will be possible to change the composition of the vaccines to protect against these variants.

Data continues to be collected and analysed on new variants of the COVID-19 virus. WHO is working with researchers, health officials and scientists to understand how these variants affect the virus’s behaviour, including their impact on the effectiveness of vaccines, if any. See WHO’s Disease Outbreak News to get up-to-date information on the impact of COVID-19 virus variants on the effectiveness of the different vaccines. This is an area where the evidence remains preliminary and is developing quickly.

While we are learning more, we need to do everything possible to stop the spread of the virus in order to prevent mutations that may reduce the efficacy of existing vaccines. In addition, manufacturers and the programmes using the vaccines may have to adjust to the evolution of the COVID-19 virus: for example, vaccines may need to incorporate more than one strain when in development, booster shots may be required, and other vaccine changes may be needed. Trials must also be designed and maintained to allow any changes in efficacy to be assessed, and must be of sufficient scale and diversity to enable clear interpretation of results. Studies of the impact of vaccines as they are deployed are also essential in order to understand their impact.

What is WHO doing to monitor and understand the impact of virus variants on the efficacy of COVID-19 vaccines?

WHO has been tracking mutations and variants since the start of the COVID-19 outbreak. Our global SARS-CoV-2 laboratory network includes a dedicated Virus Evolution Working Group, which aims to detect new changes quickly and assess their possible impact.

Research groups have carried out genomic sequencing of the COVID-19 virus and shared these sequences on public databases, including GISAID. This global collaboration allows scientists to better track how the virus is changing. WHO recommends that all countries increase the sequencing of the COVID-19 virus where possible and share data to help one another monitor and respond to the evolving pandemic.

WHO has also established a SARS-CoV-2 Risk Monitoring and Evaluation Framework to identify, monitor and assess variants of concern. It will involve components like surveillance, research on variants of concern, and evaluation of the impact on diagnostics, therapeutics and vaccines. The framework will serve as a guide for manufacturers and countries on changes that may be needed for COVID-19 vaccines.

How can we prevent future new variants of the COVID-19 virus?

Stopping the spread at the source remains key. Current measures to reduce transmission – including frequent hand washing, wearing a mask, physical distancing, good ventilation and avoiding crowded places or closed settings – continue to work against new variants by reducing the amount of viral transmission and therefore also reducing opportunities for the virus to mutate.

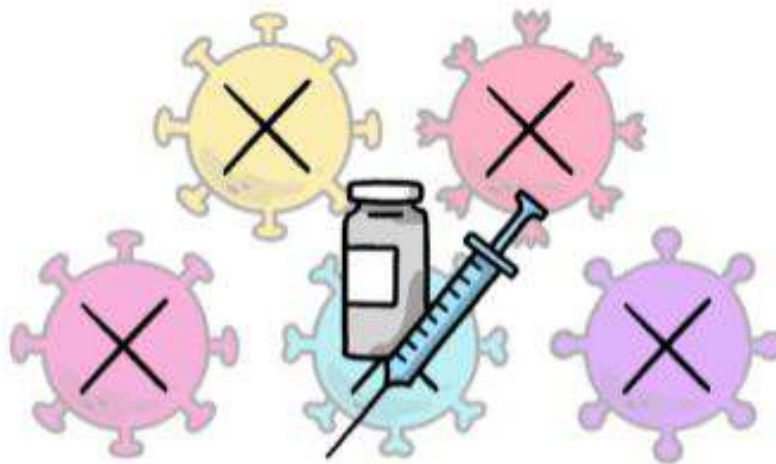
Stop the spread of the virus, and prevent strong new variants by:



Scaling up vaccine manufacturing and rolling out vaccines as quickly and widely as possible will also be critical ways of protecting people before they are exposed to the virus and the risk of new variants. Priority should be given to vaccinating high-risk groups everywhere to maximize global protection against new variants and minimize the risk of transmission. Moreover, ensuring equitable access to COVID-19 vaccines is more critical than ever to address the evolving pandemic. As more people get vaccinated, we expect virus circulation to decrease, which will then lead to fewer mutations.

Why is it important to get vaccinated even if there are new variants of the virus?

Vaccines are a critical tool in the battle against COVID-19, and there are clear public health and lifesaving benefits to using the tools we already have. We must not put off getting vaccinated because of our concerns about new variants, and we must proceed with vaccination even if the vaccines may be somewhat less effective against some of the COVID-19 virus variants. We need to use the tools we have in hand even while we continue to improve those tools. We are all safe only if everyone is safe.



And researchers are working on ways to alter the composition of vaccines to cover possible new variations.

SERVICE PROJECT UPDATE

Project Brief on Dialysis Project at Qutbullapur

Rotary Club of Secunderabad Sunrise has been dreaming about a long term project from a very long time but was not materializing for some reason or the other. In fact a fund raising project was done some time back by organizing a play “LAST OVER” wherein RCSS had mobilized some decent amount keeping in mind of a long term project.

The year 2021-22 shall be the year wherein this long term project in the shape of Dialysis Centre will be inaugurated. The Dialysis Centre project was shortlisted after analysing various projects in terms of Project costing, sustainability of the project, how the project will be beneficial to the poor and economically backward persons in the society.

There was a brainstorming session amongst the members of RCSS on which would be the right organization who can help us in starting the Dialysis Centre. It was an unanimous decision that Mahaveer Dialysis Team led by Mr. Gautam Choradia was the ideal team because of their experience, professionalism, selfless service attitude and already running around 12 Dialysis Centres successfully and performed 1 million Dialysis.

Then RCSS has approached Mahavir Dialysis team and explained that they are keen to start a Dialysis Centre with a tie-up with them. Then Mahaveer Dialysis team readily agreed that they can assist us in setting up the Dialysis and also run the Dialysis Centre. They have informed that there are lot of patients in the vicinity of Suchitra Circle, Kompally, Bowenpally, Medchal and unfortunately there is no affordable Dialysis Centre nearby. They suggested to search for a suitable place of about 4000sqft which is easily approachable in and around Suchitra Circle.

Project Brief on Dialysis Project at Qutbullapur



The search began and fortunately an ideal place was identified near Suchitra Circle (Qutbullapur) which was on main road, well furnished with all the services as required by the Mahaveer Dialysis Team. This place was approved by Mahaveer Dialysis team and immediately the RCSS team sprung into action to buy the property. Some 14 members of RCSS have been generous enough to come forward as Investors and buy the property and lease it out to Rotary Sunrise Service Trust without any rent. The RSS Trust would in turn enter into an agreement with Mahaveer Dialysis Team to assist in setting up the Dialysis Centre and also take care of the day to day operations of the Dialysis Centre.

Once the property was in place, our CSR partner BHEL GE Gas Turbine Services Pvt Ltd (BGGTS) was approached with a proposal to fund the Dialysis Machines and all the related equipments.

M/s BGGTS was impressed with the proposal and was convinced that the Dialysis Centre can help the poor /economically backward persons in the city by way of very affordable quality dialysis compared to the very expensive dialysis treatments by a lot of Hospitals. They realised that affordable Dialysis is the need of the hour and gave their acceptance to fund all the Dialysis Equipments (Capex) through their CSR funds. The non-capital funds shall be funded by the Rotary Sunrise Service Trust internal accruals.

Hopefully the Dialysis Centre may start in March 2022.

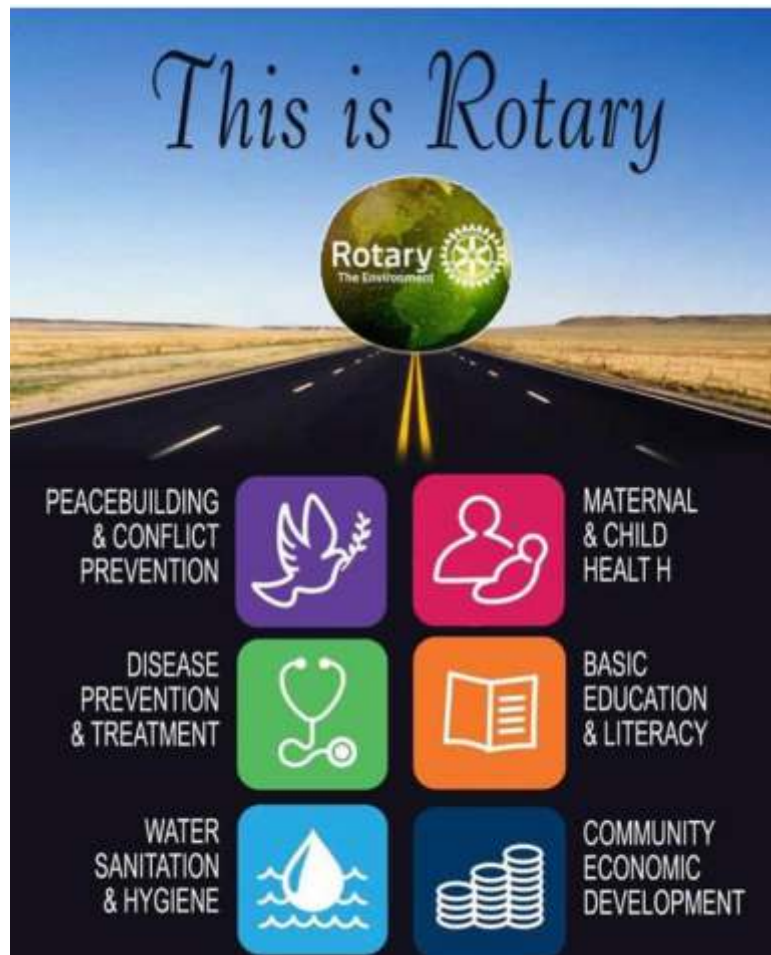
