

Revisiting different RTOs RO plants


























School Bench Distribution on 24th April 2023


Holiday's & festivals in India May Month

Tigers roaring louder: Fifty Glorious years of Project Tiger

The roar of our national animal, the Royal Bengal Tiger just got louder. Now we have a whopping estimate of 3,167 tigers as recently announced by our honourable PM Mr. Narendra Modi.

In 2006 the tiger number dwindled to 1411 setting the alarm bells and forcing conservationists to take aggressive and sincere measures which indeed have paid off seeing the results of the new census.

Project Tiger was launched as a major conservation programme on April 1, 1973 at Jim Corbett National Park. Initially it had only 9 tiger reserves under its fold and currently the number stands at 53. The consistent efforts pursued under the project have shown positive impact on the tiger population. Additionally it has resulted in creating greater awareness about wildlife conservation in general and sensitising public about its importance in greater run in aggregate.

Not only the efforts under the project has revived the tiger population back from the brink of extinction, it has given boost to eco-tourism, created employment opportunities and given rise to ancillary industries for the benefit of the local economy by generating employment and livelihood for the locals.

This massive project had its share of numerous challenges too and it continues to face so. Creating awareness about the project itself was a task as it required including the local population to involve directly into the conservation efforts. The biggest challenge was to move the villagers living in the reserves, outside the periphery of the reserve. The second challenge which still continues to be a big one is poaching. Tiger skin and other body parts are in huge demand in foreign markets which results in the animal being killed unethically and posing a hurdle to the efforts of the conservationists. The third challenge was funding of the project of this massive scale.


