World Immunization Week, Accelerating the fight against malaria Global immunization efforts have saved at least 154 million lives over the past 50 years

The global vaccine drives of the second half of the 20th century are one of humanity's greatest achievements. Immunization campaigns have enabled us to eradicate smallpox, nearly defeat polio, and ensure more children survive and thrive than ever before.



This year, during World Immunization Week, we celebrated 50 years of the Expanded Programme on Immunization (EPI), recognizing our collective efforts to save and improve countless lives from vaccine-preventable diseases and calling on countries to ramp up investments in immunization programmes to protect the next generations. In just 5 decades, we went from a world where the death of a child was something many parents feared to a world where every child, if vaccinated, has a chance to survive and thrive.







Malaria disproportionately affects those in situations of greatest poverty and vulnerability

The global vaccine drives of the second half of the 20th century are one of humanity's greatest achievements. Immunization campaigns have enabled us to eradicate smallpox, nearly defeat polio, and ensure more children survive and thrive than ever before.



249 million new cases of malaria in 2022



"Accelerating the fight against malaria for a more equitable world"

In recent years, progress in reducing malaria has ground to a standstill. Not only does malaria continue to directly endanger health and cost lives, but it also perpetuates a vicious cycle of inequity. People living in the most vulnerable situations, including pregnant women, infants, children under 5 years of age, refugees, migrants, internally displaced people, and Indigenous Peoples, continue to be disproportionately impacted.



The WHO African Region shoulders the heaviest burden of the disease, accounting, in 2022, for 94% and 95% of malaria case and deaths. Rural populations in the African region living in situations of poverty and with less access to education are the most impacted.





Whether celebrating life or death, wildlife, religious deities, rowing, or even ice sculpting, festivals add another dimension to your travels. Streets thrum with music and kaleidoscopic parades, you might see traditional rituals that aren't performed at any other time, and you're fully embraced in local life as everyone joins in with the celebrations.

we shall share our pick of festivals around the globe that we feel are worth experiencing as part of a wider trip.

1. AfrikaBurn – Tankwa, South Africa



AfrikaBurn stands as South Africa's rendition of Nevada's renowned Burning Man festival, ranking among the must-experience global festivals! Held annually from late April to early May, AfrikaBurn unfolds on a remote expanse in Tankwa, situated 400 kilometres from Cape Town in South Africa's Northern Cape. Inaugurated in 2007, the festival has burgeoned into a colossal annual gathering, magnetizing a vibrant community of music aficionados, culture enthusiasts, creators, artists, and trendsetters from across the globe. At AfrikaBurn, attendees are encouraged to immerse themselves in active participation, contributing to the creation of a dynamic city teeming with art, themed camps, music, performances, and elaborate costumes. Throughout the week, monumental wooden structures and sculptures are meticulously erected, culminating in them all being burnt akin to the ritual at Burning Man, marking the festival's culmination.







2. BaliSpirit Festival – Ubud, Bali



The annual BaliSpirit Festival, nestled in Ubud, Bali, stands as the ultimate haven for those seeking to enrich their health and wellness journey. Boasting a plethora of over 300 workshops and music sessions encompassing yoga, dance, healing practices, breathwork, martial arts, sound therapy, and more, the festival offers a holistic sanctuary for both the mind and body.

When organizing your trip to the BaliSpirit Festival, it's advisable to allocate additional time beyond the festival week to fully immerse yourself in Bali's offerings. Pre-festival events set the tone for the experience, while post-festival retreats and training programs extend and deepen the transformative journey.

With its remarkable diversity of programs set against the backdrop of Bali's spiritual and picturesque natural landscape, the BaliSpirit Festival promises an indelible and soul-stirring experience.



3. Bergen International Festival – Bergen, Norway





The Bergen International Festival is held annually in Bergen, Norway and is firmly established in the northern European arts scene, attracting over 100,000 visitors each year. 400 events are hosted at over 70 different venues and present art in all its guises including music, theatre, dance, opera and visual art. Bergen International Festival is Scandinavia's largest and most important festival. The festival programme is created with something for every taste and occasion, and the events are organised under the three terms Festivities, Foundations and Friction.

- 4. Cannes International Film Festival Cannes, France

The annual Cannes Film Festival spans 12 days, showcasing films and documentaries worldwide. It's an essential destination for film enthusiasts and those intrigued by diverse cultures.

Chopard Dinner And Party – Famed for its exquisite jewelry and watches, Chopard hosts extraordinary soirées. Tickets: From £5,000 per person

AmFAR Cinema Against AIDS Party – A glamorous affair featuring a glittering guest list and a vital fundraising auction for AIDS research. Tickets: From £13,000 to £500,000 per person

For an opportunity to mingle with Hollywood's elite (and if budget permits), the Cannes Film Festival is a must-attend event. It is considered to be one of the best top 10 festivals around the world.







5. Electric Daisy Carnival (EDC) – Las Vegas, USA



The Electric Daisy Carnival (EDC) is held annually in Las Vegas and is a globally renowned dance music festival. It is the largest dance music festival in North America and the EDC also takes place in Mexico, Florida, and Japan as well.

Under the Electric Sky, fans come together to celebrate life, love, art, and music at this unique multi-day festival. Elements mix to ignite the senses and inspire the imagination. The foundation upon which the festival was built is one of unity, love, self-expression, and respect for one another.

6. Hamamatsu Festival- Hamamatsu, Japan







The Hamamatsu Festival is held annually in early May in Hamamatsu, Japan during Golden Week. The festivals consists of 2 different aspects: the parade of floats and the huge kite flying festival. Each evening at 6:30pm (sunset) there is a procession through the streets of large ornate floats, each one representing a district of Hamamatsu. Some of the more traditional looking floats are beautifully decorated with ornate wood carvings. The floats carry children playing traditional Japanese instruments, whilst the adults carrying lanterns and flags, make noise, cheer and pull the floats along the road.

7. Hay Festival of Literature and Arts – Hay-on-Wye, Brecon Beacons National Park, South Wales



There is a quaint market town called Hay-on-Wye in Brecon Beacons National Park in South Wales that is known as the 'book town' of Wales. Every May this book town hosts The Hay Festival of Literature and Arts.

Fondly known as the 'Woodstock of the Minds', bookworms, authors and professors flock here to listen to speakers, get news on book releases, buy book-themed tote bags and of course drink the ink! Lasting for 10 days, attendees to this festival can enjoy the events, exhibitions, keynote speakers, book releases and all things literary in one of the world's biggest Literature festivals. Entry to the festival is free but you must pay for tickets to some events and workshops. There's also musicians, comedians, food trucks for the taking and the festival is very family-friendly.







8. Madeira Island Flower Festival – Funchal, Madeira, Portugal



If you are looking for a beautiful festival to attend in Europe in May, take a look at the Madeira Flower Festival (Festa da Flor). Madeira Island is a small Portuguese island in the Atlantic, often called the Island of Eternal Spring, or, the Garden of the Atlantic. That's why it is here, in the island's capital Funchal – where you will have a chance to participate in colourful flower celebrations.

The 2022 edition will last over three weeks; it is scheduled to start on the 5th of May, and last until the 29th of May. Every year during the festival, Funchal's city centre will be beautifully decorated with flowers and flower exhibitions and all sorts of flower-related concerts, markets, shows and competitions will be held.

9. New Orleans Jazz and Heritage Festival – New Orleans, USA



We have added the New Orleans Jazz and Heritage Festival in New Orleans to our post on the 'Best Festivals in April' as this is when it begins. However, this festival can be enjoyed in both April and May each year.








10. Passport DC Festival – Washington D.C., USA



Can you imagine traveling to 15 countries in an afternoon? Well, you can with at the Passport DC Festival in Washington, D.C! Each May, dozens of embassies and ambassador residences are opened to the public on a few select weekends. It's an incredible international festival of culture, art, and good food. Each embassy or residence can decide how they would like to observe the day. At the embassy for the Republic of Korea, there was K-Pop music playing, beautiful displays of art, and some food to try.





If you plan to visit Amsterdam in March, April or May, a day trip to Keukenhof (also known as the Garden of Europe) has to make it to your itinerary. It is the largest flower park in the world. More than 7 million flowers are in bloom during this time.





12. VIVID Sydney – Sydney, Australia



VIVID Sydney ranks among the globe's foremost festivals, boasting grandeur and innovation. Annually, this winter extravaganza celebrates the convergence of technology, creativity, and ingenuity, transmuting Sydney's heart into a tapestry of VIVID Light, Music, and Ideas.





Rotary Club of Secunderabad Sunrise MOVERS AND SHAKERS: PARKINSON'S AT A GLANCE



Parkinson's, a progressive neurodegenerative disorder is second most common mental disorder after Alzheimer's. It is a brain condition which occurs due to loss of nerve cells in a particular area of the brain associated with production of dopamine. This condition is categorised by a range of symptoms which aggravates as the disease progresses. An estimated 10 million people worldwide is known to be suffering from Parkinson's with China leading the tally. In India, the occurrence is approximately 76 to 1,00,000 (one of the least worldwide). Approximately 90,000 people are diagnosed with it every year in the USA alone.

The typical symptoms include:

- 1. **Tremors:** Shaking of the limbs especially hands is one of the early characteristic symptoms of the disease. This may cause problems in holding things, to be able to write and to eat by own hands.
- 2. **Slow movements (bradykinesia):** The muscles become stiff and painful causing slow voluntary movements like steps becoming shorter, dragging feet as you walk, difficulty in sitting and getting up, bad posture causing a stoop, difficulty in chewing and swallowing to name a few.
- 3. Loss of involuntary movements: Once the disease progresses, patient may suffer loss of involuntary movements like not being able to blink or smile; swinging of arms when walking; control of bladder or bowel.
- 4. **Loss of balance:** Due to swelling of accumulation of fluid in the lower brain, loss of balance is one of the most common symptoms associated with the disease.
- 5. **Mental symptoms**: Depression, anxiety, insecurity, irritability, dementia are some of the mental symptoms which could also be present in some patients.
- 6. **Speech:** The speech could become slurry and voice may become slow or unclear.

Diagnosis: There is no specific lab test or diagnostic technique to determine the occurrence of the disease. The diagnosis is largely based upon the symptoms and medical examination of the condition in addition to brain scans, if needed.

Men are more pre-disposed to the disease than women. The age group likely to suffer is beyond the age of 60. Certain environmental factors could be associated with the occurrence like exposure pesticides, chemicals in mining industries etc.,

Although there is no cure of the disease, it is managed with medication to give symptomatic relief in addition to certain therapies if needed like Deep Brain Stimulation, Focussed Ultrasound, yoga and tai-chi.


