<u>Air Turbulence</u> - It has been in news lately... What is turbulence?

Turbulence is the chaotic movement of air created by the shearing of winds or forced airflow up over mountains. The atmosphere is a large fluid, with waves of airflow propagating around the world. As the air becomes unstable, it breaks into fast-moving chaotic swirls. An aircraft encountering turbulence is shaken as it encounters fast-flowing, swirling airflow.

What Are the Safest Seats on a Plane?

While no part of the plane may generally be the safest, there is probably a best spot to be sitting when specific incidents happen. Of course, that's always going to depend on variables you can't control. Each airline emergency plays out differently, affecting different seats more than others each time.

"The front section, obviously, is comfortable because it's away from the engine and the noise," . But, "that's normally the first point of impact. And so it's a high vulnerability area."



The back, though liable to separate from the plane in a catastrophic crash, is more likely to stay intact than the front and middle portions that are still connected to the engines. While the middle may be better for turbulence, it's not necessarily ideal for a catastrophic situation. After all, the middle section is typically where the fuel cells are positioned, meaning if a fire is involved, you're right on top of the gas tank.

Aisle, Middle, Window

The back of the plane yet still close to an emergency exit is probably your safest bet.

You've got your row, but now which seat to pick?

Again, there are advantages and disadvantages of each option. Sitting in the aisle gets you closer to whatever exit you might need to head to in an emergency but also leaves you more vulnerable to getting walloped by falling luggage or loose debris hurtling down the aisle. Sitting by the window lets you see what's going on outside, giving you a situational advantage, but it leaves you pinned against the wall and waiting until the other people in your row squeeze out first. Occupying the middle gives you a couple of human shields on either side of you to cushion any potential blows, but the middle seat is uncomfortable and an unpopular first choice.

Despite all the recent news, it's important to remember that airline travel is remarkably safe.

The application process for the 2025 Programs of Scale grant has begun for qualified Rotary and Rotaract clubs and districts! In the first step of the process, The Rotary Foundation will accept concept notes that summarize evidence-based programs that are ready to scale over three to five years in partnership with other organizations. Concept notes will be accepted through 1 August





The Grant Competition Handbook, Concept Note Template, and Frequently Asked Questions have all been updated for this application cycle. They include details about the application, the requirement for a \$500,000 cash contribution, and the selection process. Important changes to the Rotary Citation

The Rotary Citation will become known as the Club Excellence Award starting in 2024-25. The RI Board approved this change to better convey the award's purpose as recognition of club excellence. Although the name of the award is changing, the criteria for earning it are not. Also starting next year, Rotaractors will be able to set their goals and report their achievements in Rotary Club Central, and they'll need to do so by 30 June 2025 to earn the Club Excellence Award. 

"Festivals Around The World."

Whether celebrating life or death, wildlife, religious deities, rowing, or even ice sculpting, festivals add another dimension to your travels. Streets thrum with music and kaleidoscopic parades, you might see traditional rituals that aren't performed at any other time, and you're fully embraced in local life as everyone joins in with the celebrations.

we shall share our pick of festivals around the globe that we feel are worth experiencing as part of a wider trip.

1. Bergen International Festival – Bergen, Norway



The Bergen International Festival, a yearly event in Bergen, Norway, holds a prominent position in the northern European arts scene, drawing over 100,000 attendees annually. With 400 events spread across 70 venues, the festival showcases diverse artistic expressions, spanning music, theatre, dance, opera, and visual arts. As Scandinavia's largest and most significant festival, it ranks among Europe's finest cultural celebrations.







2. Bonnaroo Music and Arts Festival – Manchester, Tennessee, USA

The Bonnaroo Music and Arts Festival is an annual four day music festival and takes place at Great Stage Park on a 650-acre farm in Manchester, Tennessee. It was founded by Superfly Productions and AC Entertainment in 2002.

In 2002, the festival was held as a one-time event but due to its popularity, the festival was held the following year and changed to a two-day event with six stages. Today it is one of the biggest music festivals in the US and you can expect a line-up of more than 150 artists performing around the clock on 10 unique stages.



3. Bordeaux Wine Festival – Bordeaux, France

Bordeaux Wine Festival or Bordeaux Fête le Vin, is an annual event that takes place in Bordeaux, France every summer from mid to late June. Starting in 1998, the festival was created to celebrate the culture and tradition of local winemakers in this region.

It started as a way to promote the wines of the region and has now become a major tourist attraction for wine enthusiasts from all over the world. Today it hosts around 1200 winemakers from Bordeaux and the entire Nouvelle-Aquitaine region.

However, this festival is much more than a celebration of wine. Visitors will be able to enjoy a variety of events such as visiting the beautiful tall ships, daily fireworks and music concerts, as well as wine tasting (of course), food tasting, cooking demonstrations and more.









4. Glastonbury Festival – Somerset, United Kingdom

The Glastonbury Festival (or Glasto, as it's known to regulars) is the largest greenfield music and performing arts festival in the world. It is an iconic, hugely popular and world- famous music festival which takes place almost every year in June over 5 huge days.

The Glastonbury Festival is held in the Vale of Avalon in the UK. This area is steeped in mythology and history, and is said to be where King Arthur was buried. The site of the festival is huge at 1.5 miles across, and taking some 900 acres in total. With such a huge site, the festival has managed to maintain its chill and hippy vibe for over 50 years, with the first festival being held in 1970.








5. Hay Festival of Literature and Arts— Hay-on-Wye, Brecon Beacons National Park,

South Wales



We have added the Hay Festival of Literature and Arts in Hay-on-Wye in the South of Wales to our post on the 'Best Festivals in May" as this is when it begins. However, this festival can be enjoyed in both May and June each year.

6. Hideout Festival – Zrce Beach, Croatia



Hideout Festival, a 5-day electronic extravaganza held annually in June or July at Croatia's Zrce Beach, seamlessly blends beach vibes, boat parties, and open-air venues. By day, revellers bask on the expansive beach, transitioning to poolside parties before evening headline performances.

7. Inti Raymi – Cusco, Peru



To mark the transition between winter and spring, Peruvians celebrate Inti Raymi in Cusco on the winter solstice (June 24, since Peru is in the southern hemisphere). Inti Raymi honours Inti, or the Incan sun god, and dates back to the early 1400's.

Today, you can join the month of June celebration, and all the festivities leading up to the event on June 24, by watching re-enactments, cheering on dancers and of course trying chicha, the Incan beer.

8. Midsommar – Sweden

9. Summerfest - Milwaukee, USA



Summerfest is an annual music festival held in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. It is not only one of the major music festivals in the US, but the world's largest music festival with attendance topping 800,000 people every year. The event takes place on a 100-acre (40-hectare) grounds in downtown Milwaukee and features twelve stages with performances from more than 1,000 artists.

Summerfest was originally a three-day festival organized by the "Milwaukee Journal" to coincide with the opening of the Milwaukee Exposition Centre on June 30, 1968. The first Summerfest was a free event and drew over 350,000 people.

10. Superman Celebration (AKA Superman Fest) – Metropolis, Illinois, USA







Whether you are a comic lover in general or a superman fanatic, visiting Superman Celebration in Metropolis, Illinois is a must! The 2024 celebration marked the 46th Annual Superman Celebration. With over 40 years of history, this celebration is more than a convention or festival. What started as a 1 day local event has grown into a 3 day celebration that welcomes Superman fans from all of the world.

Each year the celebration includes celebrity guests from a variety of film and TV. However, the entertainment doesn't end with the celebrities. Comic Artists set up their work in Artist Alley. There are carnival games, an annual car show, Super Bike Trek and a costume contest. Many other local businesses and organizations work to overlap annual events with the Superman Celebration to ensure that there is something for every fan and visitor.

11. VIVID Sydney – Sydney, Australia



VIVID Sydney is a night-time festival of lights, art and technology installations that is held annually in Sydney, Australia. The festival attractions are scattered around the central business district of Sydney, and locations close to the Sydney harbour foreshore.

VIVID Sydney runs for 3 weeks each year during the Australian winter months of late May through to early June. The festival brings together the best creative minds that Sydney has to offer, and includes musical performers, art displays, as well as numerous large scale 3D light projections.







12. White Night Festival – Saint Petersburg, Russia



The White Nights Festival is an annual summer festival from late May to July in Saint Petersburg, Russia celebrating the long light nights of northern Russia. Due to its location near the Arctic Circle, the skies only reach twilight and never reach complete darkness as the sun never sets. The natural phenomenon of the white nights lasts from late May to early July with the brightest of these nights falling between the 12th June and 2nd July.

Russia's cultural capital offers lots of events in celebration of this festival including classical music, opera, ballet and theatre performances as well as dance parties, street concerts, fireworks and the spectacular Scarlet Sails event marking the peak of the festival. The Bolshoi Theatre hosts renowned Russian ballet performances while the Mariinsky Theatre is the place to be every night for classical music and also acts as the festival's host.

Messages of peace and progress, anticipation for 2025 convention in Calgary inspire attendees



RI President R. Gordon R. McInally addresses the closing general session of the 2024 Rotary International Convention in Singapore.

After five days of friendship, excitement, and cultural connections, the 2024 Rotary International Convention in Singapore ended with a focus on the future. Speakers emphasized Rotary's continuing mission to promote peace and goodwill and previewed next year's gathering in Calgary, Canada.

Fostering understanding was a central theme of the day, as Rotary Peace Fellows María Antonia Pérez and Clara-Valentine Tigenoah celebrated the 25th year since the Rotary Peace Centers program was announced.

"To believe in peace is to have hope, and to do so, one must be both stubborn and optimistic, and be eager to persist and make a difference," Pérez said. Rotary International President R. Gordon R. McInally emphasized Rotary's long-standing commitment to building peace and noted that the topic has been a key interest almost since Rotary began.

"Our dedication to building a more peaceful world has its ups and downs, but it has been a critical part of how we define ourselves, going back even before the First World War," McInally said. "From our earliest days, we have always had a vision of our organization as something more than just the people we see right in front of us and the direct results of our service projects."

The day's breakout sessions included even more discussion of peacebuilding, with topics such as Innovating Peace Education in Times of Crisis and Understanding the Global Peace Index.







Two breakout sessions focused on starting new clubs. During the session Rotary Your Way: Form the Club You Always Wanted, people learned key steps in the process, from finding a champion to help organize the club to choosing the club's leaders.

Speakers emphasized that cause-based and interest-based clubs are a popular way to attract new members, noting that clubs can be formed among alumni of the same school, professionals in similar fields, or people who want to address a particular problem.

"Look in your own community for where Rotary is needed," advised Virginia McKenzie of the Rotary Club of The Pacific Northwest Ending Sex Trafficking, which is in Washington, USA. Yvonne Kumoji-Darko of the Rotary Club of Accra-South, Ghana, helped charter more than a dozen Rotary clubs as a district governor in 2020-21. She suggested inviting friends, relatives, community leaders, and local media outlets to a club's charter celebration to help it launch successfully.

Krishnan Chittur of the Rotary Club of Hudson Valley, New York, USA, offered another approach during the session We Formed a New Club in One Week, And So Can You!

Chittur described how he generated enthusiasm for a project to increase access to new technology that detects breast cancer. After he explained Rotary to community members who were interested in the project, they decided to form a club to help implement the initiative.

As the 2024 convention ended, people began thinking about when the global Rotary community would gather again to share experiences, get ideas, and connect with friends. "There are few moments more magical in Rotary than attending a convention," said Bryn Styles, chair of the 2025 Calgary Convention Committee and a member of the Rotary Club of Barrie-Huronia, Ontario, Canada.

Calgary is home to people of more than 240 ethnicities who speak 165 languages, Styles said. He also touted the world-famous Calgary Stampede, which will begin several days after the convention ends.

"While in Calgary, you will be mere moments away from the stunning Rocky Mountains, soaking in the majesty of the natural beauty all around you," Styles said. "Within driving distance of Calgary, you can find not one, but six UNESCO sites, including Waterton-Glacier [International] Peace Park," which Rotarians helped establish.

In the House of Friendship, visitors shared their anticipation for the next convention.

"I'm looking forward to seeing what Calgary is about," said Ken Montville, a member of the Rotary Club of Salisbury, Maryland, USA. "I've got my hotel reservations and registration. All I need is the airline ticket."
