



Rtn. Satish proposed the vote of thanks, and the event concluded with the singing of the National Anthem.










































































































































RCSS International Fellowship: Trip to Vietnam

In the month of October (5th till 12th), an international fellowship was organised under the President ship of Mr. Ranjay Goel, by Rotary Club of Secunderabad Sunrise to Vietnam. An enthusiastic group of 34 participants (members, anns and kids included) embarked upon this fantastic trip on 5th of October from Hyderabad and returned on 12th of October after successfully completing a trip of 6 nights and 7 days.

The first destination was Hanoi which is where we landed from our flight from Hyderabad. Hanoi, the capital of Vietnam is a vibrant city with a rich history. The city is an eclectic mix of modern day vibe yet equally retaining its old world charm. Some of the things which we did in Hanoi was visiting the old quarters which has some of the most iconic restaurants and cafes, visiting a Buddhist Pagoda, Ho Chi Minh Mausoleum etc. A trip to Hanoi is incomplete without exploring the Vietnamese coffee. We were spoilt for choices like salted coffee, coconut coffee, egg coffee to name a few. On the gastronomic front some participants indulged in the street food like Pho broth, Bun cha, Banh bi to name a few.

Next visit was Ninh Binh, a town 100 kilo metres From Hanoi which is popular for its lush green landscapes, river and limestone mountains and caves. We were booked for a Sampan tour here which includes a boat ride which is unique in a way that it is manoeuvred by feet and not hands. It takes you through the river amidst the mountains, paddy fields, local villages and limestone caves making it a very surreal experience.

Our next destination was Phu Quoc island which is also known as "Pearl Island" because of the Pearl farming popular here. This Vietnamese island has beautiful sandy beaches. This island is now the main focus in terms of increasing the tourist influx and the local government is developing it to make it a hot tourist spot in near future. The places to visit includes Grand world, Vinwonders, Pearl Farm and local beaches to name a few.

The last destination we visited was Da Nang. It is a very modern and vibrant metropolitan city in Vietnam located at the coast with stretch of beach running through it across the main street. This one is famous for its various Pagodas, the lady Buddha atop the Marble mountain, lively night life and local massage parlours.

The first day was dedicated to the local sightseeing in Da Nang and a short visit to Hoi An. Hoi An is a quintessential town with a laid back vibes. The town is full of colors with great display of lanterns which comes to life as the sun sets. The main attraction here is the boat ride after sunset when the lanterns come alive illuminating the entire river and creating a lively and serene atmosphere. The town is also famous for the custom tailoring with the product delivered within a very short span of time at very affordable prices and high quality.

Any visit to Vietnam is not considered worthy and complete without the visit to the most iconic landmark of the country, the Golden Bridge and Bana Hills tour which is a day trip from Da Nang. The bridge is nestled in two hands made up of rock and is golden in colour. To reach the attraction one needs to take the cable car which passes through a scenic landscape which looks out of the world and the elevation changes so fast that one can literally sense the change in weather and temperature as the elevation changes. It was hot and sunny when we boarded the cable car and cold and misty as we reached top which was totally mesmerising. The restaurant on the top serves local Vietnamese food and it's worth a try. Ba Na Hills retains remnants of the past from the times when it was French Colony like the wine cellar and Le Jardin D' Armour.

This fellowship was special in a sense that it fostered new connections, reinforced existing ones and promoted sisterhood in a very unique sense. Tours apart, the highlight of the fellowship was Karwa Chauth celebrations, birthday celebrations, bonding over snacks and mukhwaas (Indian Mouth Freshners) which members carried from India; rejoicing in eating, drinking and dancing and forging a new level of camaraderie altogether. We all returned with memories to last the lifetime.

I would appreciate the efforts of everyone who contributed to the success of the trip. It definitely had been a very fantastic experience.


