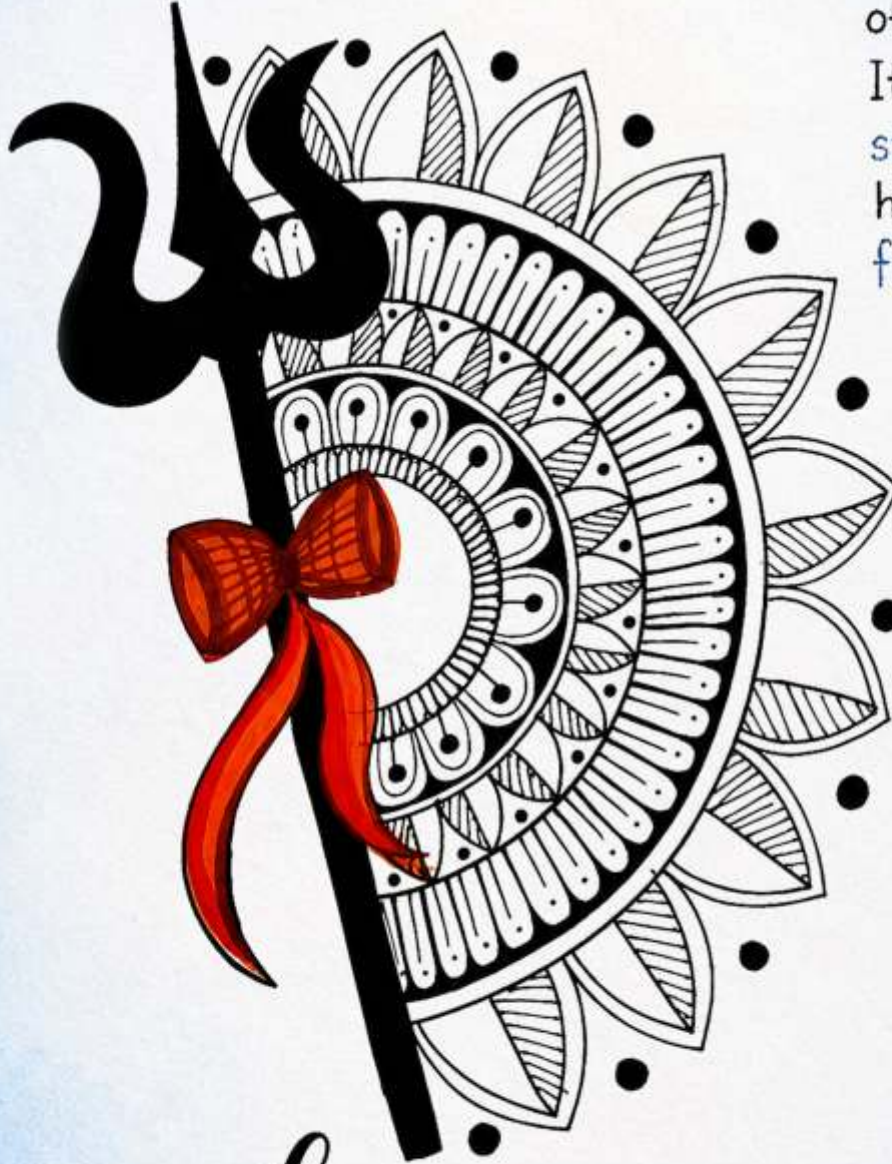

The 2026 Programs of Scale grant recipient and finalists

The Rotary Foundation has announced the 2026 Programs of Scale grant recipient: Collaboration for Sustainable Water and Sanitation Systems in Haiti. This program will expand people's access to clean water, sanitation, and hygiene; increase demand for these services; and strengthen the governance of local water systems. By doing so, it aims to improve living conditions and reduce the incidence of waterborne disease by 25% in three local government areas in Haiti.

Two other projects were designated as finalists. Home Management of Malaria in Papua New Guinea aims to reduce malaria cases among 500,000 people by training 2,100 community volunteers across more than 1,000 villages. Empowering Highland Communities in Thailand aims to transform 126 villages inhabited by highland peoples by establishing community-owned water and sanitation systems and strengthening coffee cultivation, livestock production, and traditional crafts.

Why We Travel

There are two kinds of passports.
One is issued by a government.
The other is quietly issued by life.

The first allows us to cross borders.
The second allows us to cross boundaries—of prejudice, fear, assumptions and comfort.

During the past three decades, I have been fortunate to travel across more than sixty-five countries, from bustling megacities to tiny mountain villages, from Arctic landscapes to tropical islands, from ancient civilizations to futuristic societies.

Every journey has taught me something that no classroom ever could.
Travel is not simply about collecting passport stamps.
It is about collecting perspectives.
It teaches patience while waiting for delayed trains in unfamiliar languages.
It teaches humility when you discover that happiness often exists in places with very little material wealth.
It teaches gratitude when strangers welcome you into their homes.
It teaches curiosity when history comes alive through monuments, museums and conversations.

Above all, travel reminds us that despite different cultures, religions, cuisines and traditions, humanity shares remarkably similar dreams—for peace, dignity, opportunity and hope.

Perhaps that is why Rotary and travel share a common philosophy.
Rotary believes in building goodwill, understanding and peace through service.

Travel builds those same bridges through personal experience.
When we truly understand another culture, stereotypes begin to disappear.

When we meet ordinary people across the world, differences become fascinating instead of frightening.

Today's travel is also changing.
Around the world, travellers are increasingly seeking meaningful experiences over luxury, authentic local connections over crowded tourist attractions, sustainable choices over excess, and journeys that leave destinations better than they found them. Families are travelling across generations, solo travellers are finding confidence, and many are choosing slower, deeper exploration instead of rushing through crowded itineraries.

This series is therefore not a collection of "Top 10 Places."
Instead, it is an invitation.
An invitation to discover twelve different ways of experiencing our remarkable planet.
Some journeys will challenge you.
Some will relax you.
Some will surprise you.
Some may even change your life.

“Tigers will soon be extinct from India if stringent conservation efforts are not undertaken”

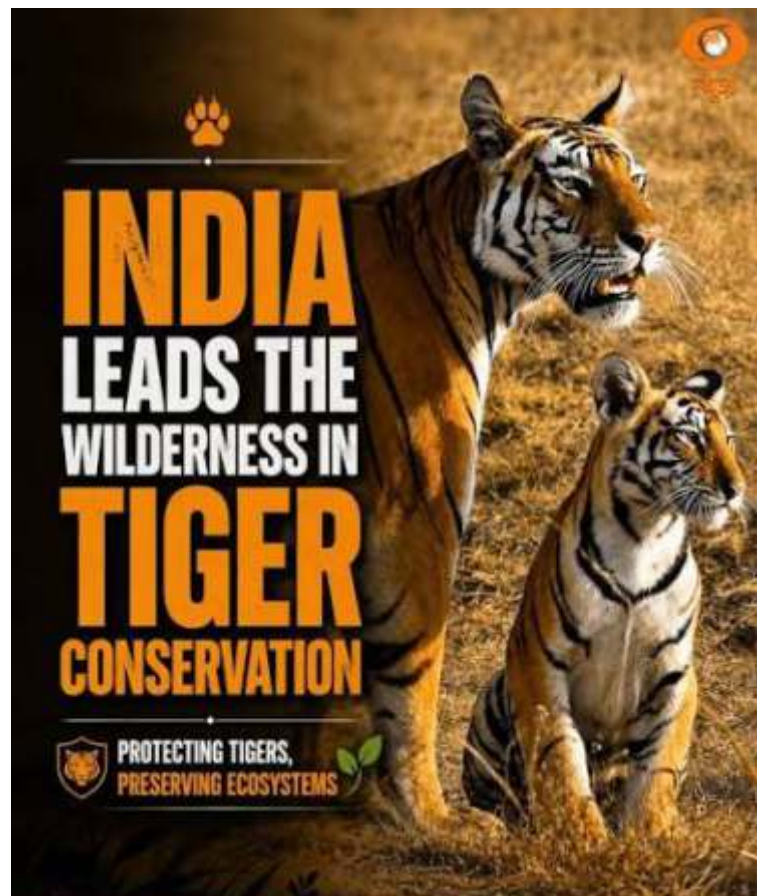
“If efforts are not made our next generation will not see tigers”

Statement like this in early 1970s set the alarm bells ringing for conservationists and forest authorities.

The might cat, a symbol of strength and power being the apex predator was at the brink of extinction due to excessive hunting and habitat loss. This called for immediate action plan and authorities jumped right in.

Royal Bengal Tiger was declared the national animal in 1972 to kick off the conservation efforts.

The scheme “Project Tiger” was implemented with an objective to protect habitats, curb poaching and create policies to directly and indirectly help in increase of tiger population.

The scheme received immense support from the government and conservationists making it one of the most celebrated success stories of conservation.

Tiger in India is considered important both from ecological and cultural point of view. It is considered the “Vahaan (Vehicle) of Maa Durga” as mentioned in the mythological texts. It has known to have existed in Indian subcontinent since centuries and has been an important part of India’s forest ecosystem.

In view of above the conservation of this might cat seemed a pressing issue.

From a mere handful in early 1970s with a bleak and uncertain future to around 3600 as per the latest census, the efforts have paid off and results are astonishing. India is now home to 70% of the global tiger population.

The scheme now covers it’s 58 tiger reserves from the initial 9 at its inception and tiger reserves covering an area of 84,500 square kilometres. More and more National parks are being made eligible to be included in the scheme to give boost to the robust efforts.

With more tigers roaring in the wild, the future looks bright and promising. This project not only highlights the result of untiring conservation efforts but has become synonymous with stories of perseverance, resilience and gratification.

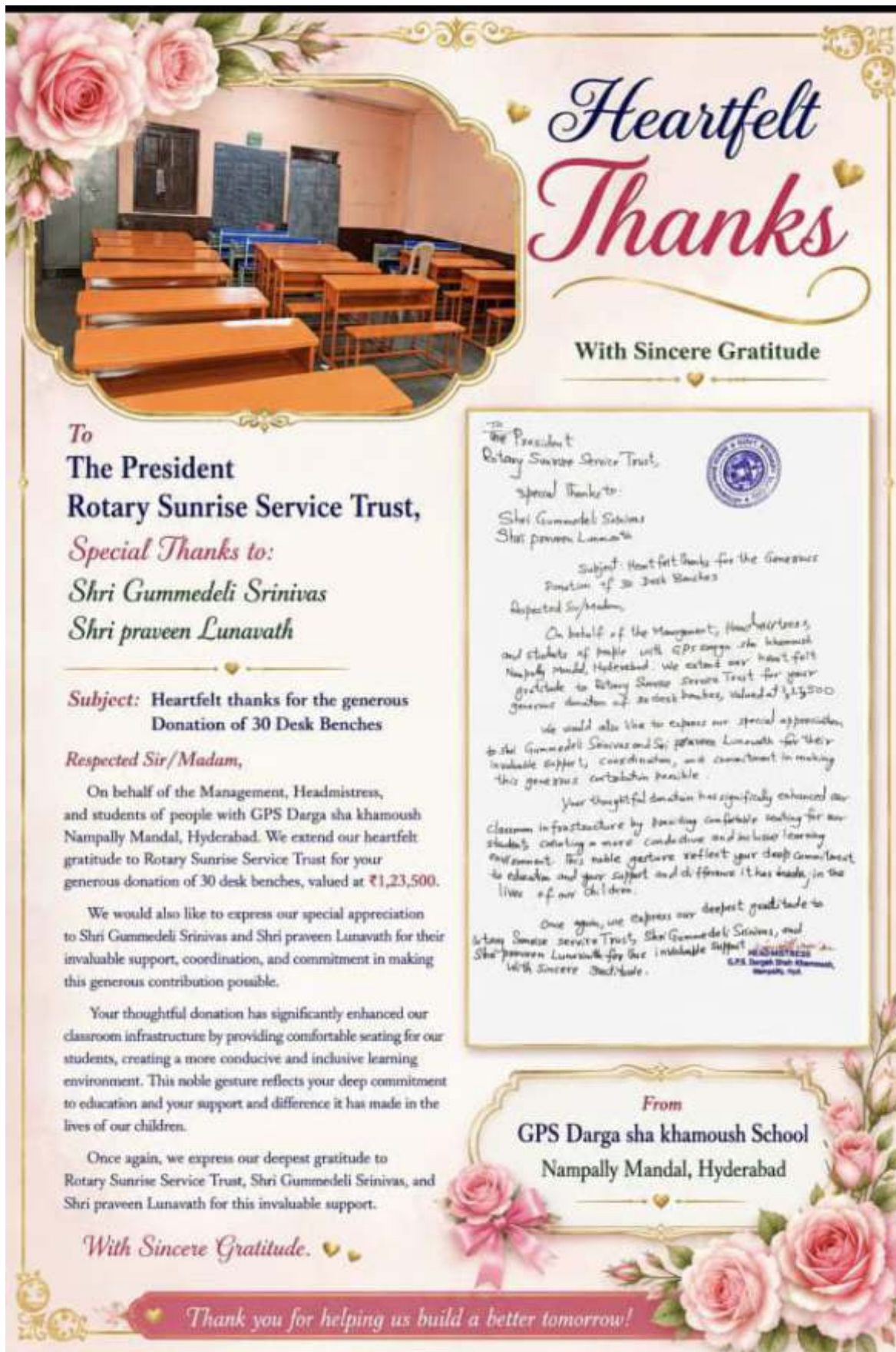

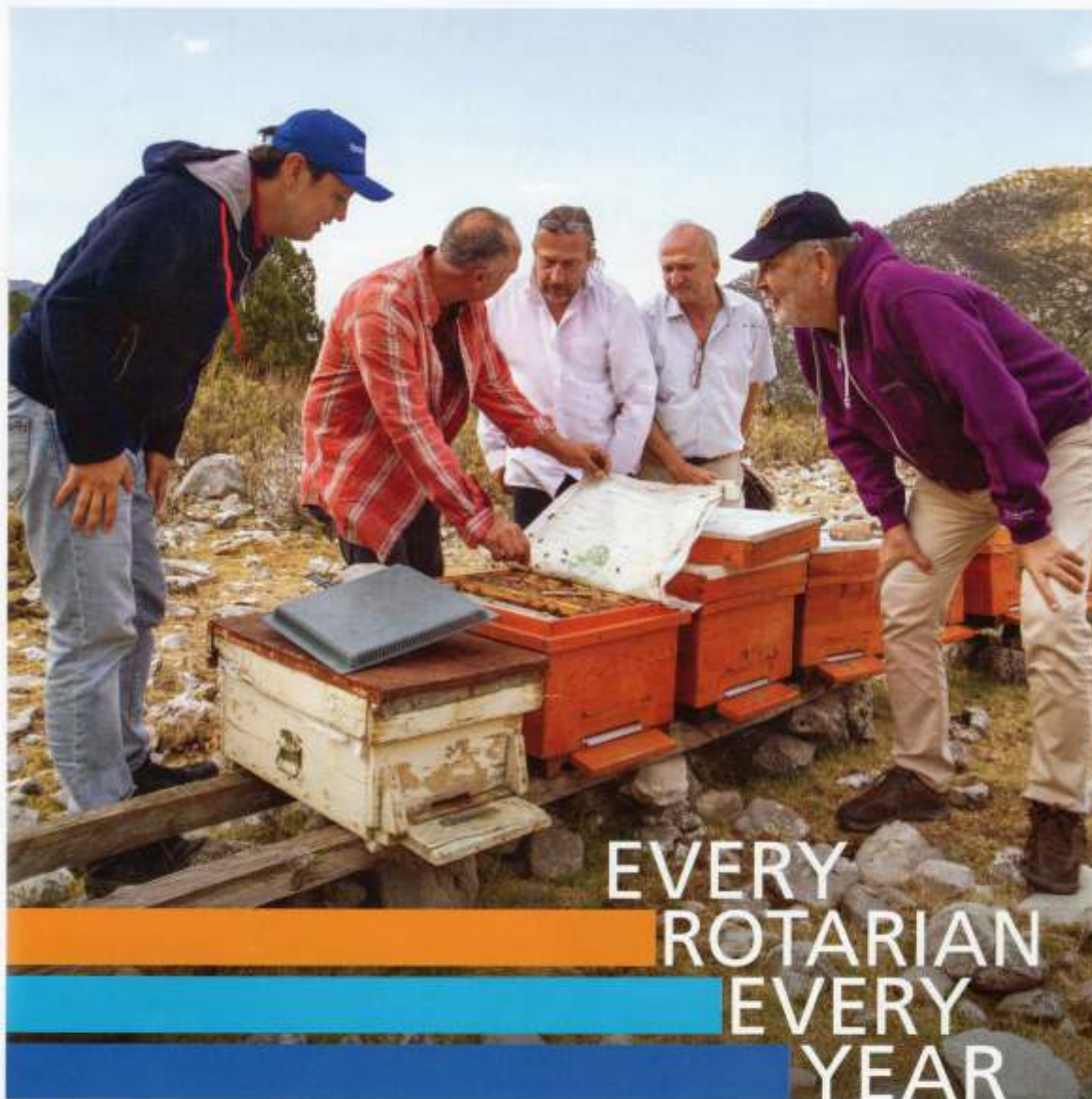
