

#### What is Rotary?



Rotary International is a volunteer organization of Rotarians & Rotaractors of business and professional leaders who provide humanitarian services and help to build good will and peace in the world. There are approximately 1.2 million Rotarians belonging to 35,454 Rotary clubs in more than 200 countries and geographical areas. Founded in Chicago in 1905, Rotary celebrated 100 years of services in 2005. The Rotary foundation has awarded more the US \$ 4.7 billion grants, which are administered at the local level by Rotary clubs.

#### What is the purpose of Rotary?

Rotary clubs exists to improve communities through a range of humanitarian, inter cultural and educational activities. Clubs advance international understanding by partnering with clubs in other countries. Rotary also encourages high standards in all vocations.

#### What do Rotary clubs do?

Rotary clubs address critical issues at home and abroad by providing health care and medical supplies, clean water, food, job training, youth development and education of people in need. Examples of rotary's focus areas include:

Polio Eradication: In 1985, Rotary international created Polio Plus - a program to immunize all the world's

children against polio. To date, Rotary has contributed more than US \$ 1.9 billion and countless volunteer hours to the protection of more than 2.5 billion children in 122 countries. Rotary has committed to raising 50 million dollars per year to be matched 2 to 1 by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation amounting to 150 million dollars for Polio eradication annually. These efforts are providing much needed polio vaccine, operational support, medical personnel, laboratory equipment and educational materials for health workers and parents. In addition, Rotary has played a major role in decisions by donor governments to contribute over \$ 8 billion to the effort. With its community based network worldwide, Rotary is the volunteer arm of the global partnership dedicated to eradicating polio. Rotary volunteers assist in vaccine delivery, social mobilization and logistical help in cooperation with the national ministries, the World Health Organization (WHO), UNICEF and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

**Peace:** In an effort to educate tomorrow's peacemakers and ambassadors, up to 110 Rotary World Peace Fellows are sponsored each year to study at one of the right universities for the International Studies in peace and conflict resolution. Since 2002 the Rotary peace centers have trained more than 1300 fellows who now work in more than 150 countries.

International Education: Rotary is the world's largest privately-funded source of international scholarships. Each year, about 1,000 university students receive Rotary scholarships to study abroad. Rotary clubs also coordinate a high school-age student exchange program that has sent nearly 8,000 students abroad for three months to a year,

**Humanitarian Projects**: Rotary clubs initiate thousands of humanitarian service projects every year. These volunteer-driven projects address the root causes of conflict, such as hunger, poverty, disease and illiteracy.

Literacy: Rotary clubs work to improve literacy rates worldwide. A unique, Rotary pioneered approach called the Concentrated Language Encounter (CLE) has proven very effective in resource-strapped developing countries. It was so successful in Thailand, that the Thai Government adopted the program nationwide.

**Water Management:** Recognizing the importance of clean water, many Rotary clubs help to dig wells and develop water treatment and distribution systems to increase access to fresh drinking water for communities in need, especially in developing countries.

Urchick has been an RI director and Rotary Foundation trustee and has served Rotary in numerous capacities, including as training leader, regional Rotary Foundation coordinator, and RI president's representative. In addition, Urchick was a representative and member-at-large at three sessions of the Council on Legislation.

Urchick has also served as chair of the Strategic Planning Committee and The Rotary Foundation's Centennial Celebration Committee, as well as a member of various Rotary committees, including the Election Review Committee and Operational Review Committee.

A Rotary member since 1991, Urchick has participated in a variety of international service projects, including National Immunization Days in India and Nigeria. In Vietnam, she worked with clubs to help build a primary school and traveled to the Dominican Republic to install water filters. A student of several Slavic languages, she has mentored new Rotary members in Ukraine and coordinated a Rotary Foundation grant for mammography equipment and a biopsy unit for a hospital in Poland. In its commemorative book, the Rotary Club of Krakow, Poland, noted Urchick as a key figure for helping the rebirth of Rotary in post-Communist Poland. Urchick has also helped to pair clubs and districts in the U.S. with Rotary clubs in Albania, Kosovo, and Ukraine for humanitarian and educational services.

Urchick's professional background is in the higher education, consulting, and entertainment industries. She received her doctorate degree in Leadership Studies from Indiana University of Pennsylvania and has been recognized by The Rotary Foundation and numerous community and international organizations.







#### Our Causes: Ending Polio

Rotary is dedicated to causes that build international relationships, improve lives, and create a better world to support our peace efforts and end polio forever.





#### **Ending Polio**

#### What is polio?

Polio, or poliomyelitis, is a paralyzing and potentially deadly infectious disease that most commonly affects children under the age of 5. The virus spreads from person to person, typically through contaminated water. It can then attack the nervous system.

#### What Is Polio?

#### The Disease

Poliomyelitis is a highly infectious disease that most commonly affects children under the age of 5. Most know it as poliovirus. The virus is spread person to person, typically through contaminated water. It can attack the nervous system, and in some instances, lead to paralysis. Although there is no cure, there is a safe and effective vaccine – one which Rotary and our partners use to immunize over 2.5 billion children worldwide.





#### **Our goal**

Rotary has been working to eradicate polio for more than 35 years. Our goal of ridding the world of this disease is closer than ever.

As a founding partner of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, we've reduced polio cases by 99.9 percent since our first project to vaccinate children in the Philippines in 1979.

#### Our Causes: Ending Polio



Rotary members have contributed more than \$2.1 billion and countless volunteer hours to protect nearly 3 billion children in 122 countries from this paralyzing disease. Rotary's advocacy efforts have played a role in decisions by governments to contribute more than \$10 billion to the effort.

Today, polio remains endemic only in Afghanistan and Pakistan. But it's crucial to continue working to keep other countries polio-free. If all eradication efforts stopped today, within 10 years, polio could paralyze as many as 200,000 children each year.

### Rotary and the Fight Against Polio

#### Rotary vs. Polio: A Timeline

Rotary is an international community that brings together leaders who step up to take on the world's toughest challenges, locally and globally. The eradication of polio is one of our longest standing and most significant efforts. Along with our partners, we have helped immunize more than 2.5 billion children against polio in 122 countries. We have reduced polio cases by 99.9 percent worldwide and we won't stop until we end the disease for good.



#### Our Causes: Promoting Peace







Today, over 120 million people are displaced as a result of conflict, violence, persecution, and human rights violations. Half of them are children.

We refuse to accept conflict as a way of life. Rotary projects provide training that fosters understanding and provides communities with the skills to resolve conflicts.

#### Rotary creates environments of peace

As a humanitarian organization, peace is a cornerstone of our mission. We believe when people work to create peace in their communities, that change can have a global effect. By carrying out service projects and supporting peace fellowships and scholarships, our members take action to address the underlying causes of conflict, including poverty, discrimination, ethnic tension, lack of access to education, and unequal distribution of resources.

Our commitment to peacebuilding today answers new challenges: how we can make the greatest possible impact and how we can achieve our vision of lasting change. We are approaching the concept of peace with greater cohesion and inclusivity, broadening the scope of what we mean by peacebuilding, and finding more ways for people to get involved.

#### Our Causes: Promoting Peace







#### We believe good health care is everyone's right. Yet 400 million people in the world can't afford or don't have access to basic health care.

Disease results in misery, pain, and poverty for millions of people worldwide. That's why treating and preventing disease is so important to us. We lead efforts both large and small. We set up temporary clinics, blood donation centers, and training facilities in underserved communities struggling with outbreaks and health care access. We design and build infrastructure that allows doctors, patients, and governments to work together.

Our members combat diseases like malaria, HIV/AIDS, Alzheimer's, multiple sclerosis, diabetes, and polio. Prevention is important, which is why we also focus on health education and bringing people routine hearing, vision, and dental care.





#### Our Causes: Providing Clean Water







Clean water, sanitation, and hygiene education are basic necessities for a healthy environment and a productive life.

When people have access to clean water and sanitation, waterborne diseases decrease, children stay healthier and attend school more regularly, and mothers can spend less time carrying water and more time helping their families.

More than 775 million people over the age of 15 are illiterate. That's 17 percent of the world's adult population.

Our goal is to strengthen the capacity of communities to support basic education and literacy, reduce gender disparity in education, and increase adult literacy. We support education for all children and literacy for children and adults.

## Rotary makes high-quality health care available to vulnerable mothers and children so they can live longer and grow stronger.

#### What's involved?

RYLA events are organized locally by Rotary clubs and districts for participants ages 14-30. Depending on community needs, RYLA may take the form of a one-day seminar, a three-day retreat, or a weeklong camp. Typically, events last 3-10 days and include presentations, activities, and workshops covering a variety of topics.

Your community might host a RYLA event for secondary school students to hone their leadership potential, for university students to develop creative problem-solving strategies, or for young professionals to learn ethical business practices.

#### Our Programs : Peace Fellowships





Each year, Rotary awards up to 130 fully funded fellowships for dedicated leaders from around the world to study at one of our peace centers.

Through academic training, practice, and global networking opportunities, the Rotary Peace Centers program develops the capacity of peace and development professionals to become effective catalysts for peace. The fellowships cover tuition and fees, room and board, round-trip transportation, and internship and field-study expenses.

Since the program began in 2002, the Rotary Peace Centers have trained more than 1,800 fellows who now work in over 140 countries. Many serve as leaders in governments; NGOs; education and research institutions; peacekeeping and law enforcement agencies; and international organizations like the United Nations and the World Bank.

#### **Our fellowships**

The Rotary Peace Fellowship is designed for leaders with work experience in peace and development. Our fellows are committed to community and international service and the pursuit of peace. Each year, The Rotary Foundation awards up to 50 fellowships for master's degrees and up to 80 for certificate studies at premier universities.







#### Our Programs: Rotary Community Corps





A Rotary Community Corps (RCC) is a group of non-Rotarians who share our commitment to changing the world through service projects.

RCC members plan and carry out projects in their communities in collaboration with local Rotary clubs. Sponsored by a Rotary club, an RCC leverages Rotary's network, brand, and mentorship by partnering with clubs to plan and implement service projects. RCCs increase Rotary's impact and expand its reach by bringing the knowledge and talents of local people to strengthen their community through sustainable projects.

## How long do exchanges last?

Long-term exchanges last a full academic year, and students attend local schools and live with multiple host families.

Short-term exchanges last from several days to three months and are often structured as camps, tours, or homestays that take place when school is not in session.

### What are the costs?

Room and board are provided, as well as any school fees. Each program varies, but students are usually responsible for:

- · Round-trip airfare
- Travel insurance
- Travel documents (such as passports and visas)
- Spending money and any additional travel or tours

### How can I apply?

Candidates are ages 15-19 and are leaders in their schools and communities. Contact your local Rotary club to see what exchange opportunities are available and what the application process involves.

# Want to offer a scholarship?

Rotary clubs can apply to The Rotary Foundation for district and global grants to support scholarships.

# Global grant scholarships

Global grants are for graduate students studying abroad in one of Rotary's areas of focus:

- 1. Promoting peace
- 2. Fighting disease
- 3. Providing clean water, sanitation, and hygiene
- 4. Saving mothers and children
- **5.** Supporting education
- 6. Growing local economies
- 7. Protecting the environment

Scholarships last from one to four years and can include an entire degree program. Global grant scholarships are funded using District Designated Funds (DDF), cash, and directed gifts and endowment earnings. The Foundation will provide an 80% World Fund match for all DDF contributions.

# **District grants**

District grants can be used to sponsor secondary school, undergraduate, or graduate students studying any subject, either locally or abroad. The scholarship may cover any length of time, from a six-week language training program to a year or more of university study.

### **Rotary Peace Fellowships**

Rotary members are essential to recruiting qualified candidates for Rotary Peace Fellowships. You can advance peace around the world by promoting peace fellowships and supporting peace fellow candidates through the application process.




# Rotary India Map - District 3150 Map





The Rotary Youth Exchange (Rye) has a lofty motto - to build peace on earth, one youth at a time! And they have been doing it since 50 years! 2025 marks 50 years of exchanges of youth between 15 and 19 criss crossing the world each year. Each year, Rotary Districts round the world partner with each other to send and receive almost 6000 young people, on this wonderful transformational program.

# What makes this unique?

How is it different from just visiting another country while on a holiday with family? And herein lies the heart of the program. Every child is a son or a daughter to the districts who send and receive them.

The students live with Rotarian families as their own. They learn the ways of their new home and through it their host country. They attend school, explore new subjects, learn a new language and absorb the new culture. They learn to adapt, adjust, give and take, blend, as well as stand out. They are proud ambassadors for their country.

During a Long Term Exchange Program, which is for 10 to 11 months, they also learn to live away from their families and friends, take responsibility for their actions and build confidence through the choices they make. They learn how to manage money and build skills of communication while addressing groups of Rotarians or peers. They make life long friendships with their host families and with other exchanges round the world. Above all, they learn that all human beings are one large family.

Which school or university can provide all this in such a short time in an international set up? The answer is clear. The year when students go on the program is actually an add on educational year for life, and not a loss of a year as some believe! All the parents and students of those who have grabbed this opportunity, will vouch for it.

Our district 3150 has been running the exchange program since several decades. We have RYE Alumni who are now Rotarians and enriching their communities.




# **Celebrating Unsung Champions**


#### **Our Key Project Distribution by Cost**

## State of the art e-learning centers in 30 Government schools

Category: Education

As part of the CSR program of Rotary Club of Bangalore West, RID 3192, under the CSR grant from Goldman Sachs, Rotary club of Sainikpuri has been able to setup 30 e-Learning centers in 30 different Government high schools within the Greater Hyderabad area, Each center consisted of a dedicated room with 30 or more state of the art laptops, computer software and applications, tables, chairs, power back up, network connectivity, air conditioning, projector, etc. to make them readily usable for e-Learning. The objective of the project is to introduce the key high technology to students at a very early level and help them with their creativity and innovation, so that they become industry ready once their education completes. The cost of setup for each e-Learning center was between INR 10-15 Lakhs. and a running cost of INR 2-3 Lakhs each year. Approximately 1200 students are being benefited.

## Signature project: Thalassemia Care, Awareness & Prevention

Category: Health

Rotary club of Sainikpuri has taken up Thalassemia care as a signature project from the year 2020-21 and further expanded it to Thalassemia care, awareness and prevention. Patients need to get blood transfusions approximately once every 3-4 weeks, from their very childhood till as long as they live. This makes the child go through significant suffering and trauma, and can lead to medical complexities. A simple blood test called HPLC can help a person to know if he or she is a Thalassemia carrier. A task force has been created with multiple clubs participation, with the objective to conduct regular blood donation camps to help exclusively Thalassemia children, to raise awareness among youngsters by giving sessions in colleges and corporate offices, and to steer the youngsters to get HPLC testing done to know if they are Thalassemia carriers and to avoid marital engagement of two Thalassemia carriers. goal is to realize a Thalassemia-free India and Thalassemia-free world by taking the simple steps necessary to prevent Thalassemia.
