Nominating Committee names choice for 2005-06 RI president

Carl- Wilhelm Stenhammar of the Rotary Club of Goteborg, Sweden, is the choice of the RI Nominating Committee for President of Rotary International in 2005-06, which met on 8 September. He will become the official nominee on 1 December if there are no challenging candidates. Stenhammar, a food broker for international products, is the former owner of Gust.F.Bratt AB. In addition, he has been a member of the boards of several companies and served as chairman of the board of a local private school.

• A Rotarian since 1974, Stenhammar served on the R I Board of Directors in 1996-98. He has also served RI as district governor, committee member and chairman, and task force general coordinator. Currently, Stenhammar chairs the permanent Fund Committee 'for Europe and RIBI and is general coordinator of the Literacy and Education Task Force. He is a member of the Polio Eradication Advocacy Task Force, a Polio Plus National Advocacy Advisor, and was chairman of the Presidential Celebration Committee -Peace and Tolerance, which was held in Sweden in August, 2003.

Immunization activities in four countries target more than 35 million

Tens of millions of children in four countries in Asia and Africa have been targeted in polio immunization campaigns in the past week. Rotarians and health workers, as well as UNICEF and World Health Organisation (WHO) representatives, government officials, and local leaders joined forces in Afghanisthan Ethiopia, Nigeria, and Pakistan to ensure that the polio vaccine is carried to difficult-to-reach communities.

<u>UN Association honors California Rotarian1club</u> <u>for humanitarian work</u>

A California Rotarian and his Rotary club have been chosen to receive the 2003 Eleanor Roosevelt Human Rights Award from a local chapter of the United Nations Association of the USA. Past District Governor Steve Brown and the Rotary Club of La Jolla Golden Triangle will receive the award from the San Diego chapter of the national UN association on 25th October.

Brown and the La Jolla Rotary club have been involved with many international. educational and humanitarian efforts including sponsoring clean water projects, as well as provision of scholarships and other forms of educational support for street children and students in Kenya.

"I find the recognition by the UN Association of San Diego to be most gratifying because through Rotary Foundation programs I have been working to advance the goal of world understanding and peace and that certainly is what the United Nations programs are meant to do in the big picture," says Brown. "I think this additional link between our two organizations is very worthwhile."

<u>Seattle Club inducts William H.Gates Sr.</u> <u>as honorary member</u>

William H.Gates Sr., Chairman of the bill and Melinda Gates foundation, has long been a friend of Rotary. In 2002, he presented The Rotary Foundation with the Gates Awards for Global Health in recognition of rotary's leadership in public health initiatives. He also spoke to a conference of large Rotary clubs in Seattle last year. And Gates has been an occasional guest of the rotary club of Seattle.

State of the art polio surveillance lab opens in Pakistan

On 11 September, Rotary Foundation Trustee Fumio Tamamura and Pakistani Rotarians celebrated the opening of a key polio surveillance laboratory in Pakistan, one of seven remaining polio-endemic countries. Pakistan borders two of the seven remaining Polio-endemic nations, Afghanistan and India, which were respectively hit by 10 and 1,600 cases last year. Together, India, Pakistan, and Nigeria represent more than 95 percent of the world's polio cases. The remaining polio endemic nations in order of transmission risk, from highest to lowest, are: Egypt, Afghanistan, Somalia, and Niger

<u>RIBI Rotarians set Guinness Record with health</u> <u>initiative.</u>

Rotarians in Britain and Ireland have made it into the Guinness book of records with a health initiative they helped implement early this year.

"Rotary International in great Britain and Ireland (RIBI) in partnership with the Stroke Association took blood pressure readings from a total of 127,573 people at over 1,000 sites across the UK on 5 april,2003,"reads the certificate sent to the RIBi secretariat by the keeper of records at the Guinness Book of Records.

Clubs sponsored the event to address the alarming incidence of stroke in the RIBI area. At each of the sites, qualified medical staff checked the blood pressure of participants and, when necessary, advised them about lifestyle changes and further health care. Each examinee was issued a card to take to his or her doctor.
