ROTARY / UN DAY

More than 800 Rotarians, Rotaractors, and guests from 22 U.S. states and more than 30 countries attended the Rotary/ UN day at the United Nations Headquarters, New York, on 4 October. R.I. President Jonathan Majiyagbe, who gave an opening and closing address, told participants that the event was a celebration of Rotary's fulfilling

relationship with the United Nations and the fourth object of Rotary: "The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace".

"Together, the UN and Rotary are like members of an extended family - a family that shares core values and a common vision," he said. "I think that this vision was so eloquently expressed by John F.Kennedy, who said this: 'We must seek above all a world of peace in which people dwell together in mutual respect and work together *in* mutual regard."

Vocational Project .shelters more than 1,700 ofIndia's poor students. Some of the most successful humanitarian projects associated with Rotary are the result of personal initiative as demonstrated by a vocational service project adopted by the Rotary Club of Chikmagalur, Karnataka, India. Aimed at providing a safe place to study for candidates from poor families while sitting for their secondary school leavers certificate examinations, the 11year-old project is the brainchild of club member K.S.Ramesh.

The idea came to Ramesh on a rainy April day in 1991. As he passed through a school can1pus during his morning walk, he noticed a large group of boys and girls huddled in the school's corridor studying in spite of the chilly weather and rain dripping from the broken tiles.

On enquiring, he found out that they were candidates waiting to sit an exam later that morning. Their homes were too far and transportation too inefficient and expensive for them to commute daily to the examination center. Each year, such students

Students traveled to Chikmagalur, 40-50 kilometers away from their rural homes. During 12 days of preparing and appearing for examinations, they were forced to live in the open without rooms or toilet facilities.

A distressed Ramesh decided to involve his family and Rotary club in a project to assist such poor students. Since 1992, the Lakshmidevamma K. Surappa Setty Vysya Hostel, established with financial contributions from the Ramesh family trust, has been taking in poor students in need of accommodations during the examination season.

This year, the hostel took in 190 students. More than 1,700 children from poor rural families have benefited from the initiative since its inception in 1992.

"You are our mother, father, and guru," Rajesh, a beneficiary of the wrote in a thank you letter to Ramesh. "You looked after us, gave us the same love affection that we receive in our homes... We cannot repay you in this lifetime."

Ramesh says that' supporting the project every year is a good way for him to fulfill his obligations as a Rotarian."I am part of the society and this obliges me to give back to the society," he says.
