Majiyagbe becomes first RI president to address National Press Club

RI President Jonathan Majiyagbe addressed the National Press Club in Washington, DC, USA, on 10 May at the weekly lunch on broadcast to millions on public affairs television C-SPAN and National Public Radio and their affiliate stations across the United States. The RI president also drew a live audience of Press Club Members, diplomats, journalists, Rotarians, and business executives.

"Today for the first time in Press Club history, we welcome to our podium a president of Rotary International, one of the world's oldest and largest humanitarian service organizations," said National Press Club President Sheila Cherry, while introducing the RI President. "Like the National Press Club, Rotary elects a new president every year, but unlike the National Press Club. Rotary expects its president to be on the road for most of the year, visiting Rotary clubs' projects and conference throughout the world".

"We (Rotarians) come together with diverse and sometimes antagonistic views on issues," said the RI president. "Through volunteer projects, we learn to get along better with each other and concentrate more on the things we have in common than on things that drive us apart, which of course is what we're all striving for."

<u>R I honors U.S. lawmakers for supporting polio work.</u>

On 12 May, Rotary International honored select members of the U.S. Congress and Senate with the Polio Eradication Champion Award for their support in securing critically needed funds to achieve a polio-free world.

The Polio Eradication Champion Award was established in 1995 to recognize world leaders who have made outstanding contributions toward the goal of eradicating polio. Past honorees include former U.S. President Bill Clinton; former prime ministers John Major of the UK and Ryutaro Hashimoto of Japan; presidents Chen Shui-Bian of Taiwan, Pervez Musharraf of Pakistan, O1usegun Obasanjo of Nigeria, Mamadou Tandja of Niger, and Jose Eduardo dos

Santos of Angola; Queen Beatrix Wilhelmina Armgard of the Netherlands; UN Secretary-General Kofi Annan; Development and Cooperation Ministers Heidemarie Wieczorek-Zeul of Germany and Eveline Herfkens of The Netherlands; Sushma Swaraj, India's minister of health and family welfare; and Egypt's First Lady Suzanne Mubarak.

Botswana holds emergency polio immunization

The southern African nation of Botswana is immunizing close to 200,000 children under age five against polio, following the reporting of a case of polio infection in February. Health Minister Lesego Motsumi launched the four-day emergency Campaign at a clinic in the national capital Gaborone on10 May

"The government has given priority to the campaign and has committed both human and financial resources - a total of US\$1.2 million, of which \$71 0,000 is from the government," said Motsumi in a global polio eradication initiative press release. "I look forward to the day when no child in Botswana will beat risk from the life-long physical disability and mental anguish associated with this terrible paralytic disease."

"The massive effort being launched in Botswana today is testimony to Africa's commitment to getting polio eradication back on track and ending this terrible disease," said RI President Jonathan Majiyagbe in a nationally televised live address at the National Press Club in Washington, D.C., USA, on 10 May. "Just eight years ago, in 1996, polio aralyzed more than 75,000 children across the continent. Last year, fewer than 500 cases were reported in Africa."
