Efforts will have to be put in to make sure that maximum number of children take advantage of the medication. Lot of ideas to make the NID's more effective were floated and hopefully some of them would be implemented on the next NID.

13th DG Visit

The DG's visit was held at Hotel Kamat Lingapur from 5:30 PM onwards.

The program started with the DG Rtn. Sam and the Asst. Governor Rtn. Suresh Khemani interacting with the President Elect and the Board in the Club Assembly. They were highly impressed with the meticulous planning, execution and documentation of all the programs undertaken by the club.

Later in the general assembly Rtn. Suresh Khemani lauded all the past presidents for being active and supporting the cause of Rotary. the participants did not lose their enthusiasm. Guest members from other clubs and a few other guests also joined in the fun. It was indeed a very colorful event with multicolored kites in the sky. Shraavan Malani had also arranged for some great music and fancy kites in the shape of birds, dragons etc., which were flown at the end of the evening. Some of the elder members who were not interested in the kite flying sessions played cards (now a ubiquitous feature of all sunrise fellowships). The evening ended with chat dinner and the members reluctantly dispersed.

20th - Visit to Krysto Ashram

Krysto's Ashram is running a school for orphan/destitute students. Hostel facility (Boarding & Lodging) is also provided for all the students in a separate building close to the school which is run from the Church premises. The orphanage was established in Nov'1992 with just 2 students and at present takes care of about 42 children. The organization is taking care of street children, abandoned children and children's of prostitutes. The organization is aiming to start separate hostel for handicapped children. Some of the members of our club Rtn. Ramayya, Rtn Subhas, Rtn. Sarathy, Rtn. George, Rtn Amarnath and Rtn. Kailash Gupta led by our president visited the club and distributed shoes to all the students. Kitchen items, utensils, eating plates, glasses (all stainless steel) costing about Rs.7000/- were also handed over to the school. The club have assured them of further assistance for mattresses, fans etc. Mr.Ramayya, Director community services spoke to the children and advised them to inculcate habit of helpfulness to others. Principles of Rotary and the Rotary 4-way test were also explained to the children. Mr.Ravindra Nair, founder of this orphanage thanked the members of RCSS profusely.
