NewRI President Takes Office

RI President Glenn Estess Sr. took office on 1 July with a call to celebrate Rotary's achievements of the past 100 years and work for a second century of success through initiatives that promote the ideals of the organization.



Estess is the retired CEO of Glenn Estess Associates, Inc. He was chairman of the YMCA, the American Chemical Society, and the Arthritis Foundation. A Rotarian since 1960, Estess is a member of the Rotary Club of Shades Valley, Birmingham, Alabama.

He has served RI as District Governor, International Assembly Group Discussion leader and Moderator, Polio Plus National Coordinator, Committee Member and Chair, Rotary Information Counselor, President's Aide, Foundation Trustee, Director, and Vice President. He is a Rotary Foundation Major Donor, a Benefactor, and a Paul Harris Fellow.

"When I consider the possibilities of Rotary's second century, I have the audacity to believe that Rotary and its Foundation can help make it possible for peoples everywhere to have three meals a day for their bodies, education and culture for their minds, and dignity, equality and freedom for their spirits," says President Estess.

"That is why, first and foremost, we will Celebrate Rotary this year by putting Service Above Self and showing the world what Rotary can do to uplift millions of people who remain trapped in poverty."

As the Centennial president, Estess appropriately starts the year with a schedule of Founders' Day events at venues in the United States to recognize the four original members of the world's first Rotary club.

G8 Nations Summit Recognizes Rotary

During the G8 Summit last week in Sea Island, Georgia, USA, world leaders reaffirmed their commitment to taking all of the necessary steps to eradicate polio by the end of 2005 and recognized the important contributions Rotary International has made to the eradication effort. A statement issued by the White House summarizing planned G8 action through the end of 2005 communicated that the G8 "welcomed and recognized the special contribution made by Rotary International to the eradication of polio." The spearheading partners of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative - the World Health Organization (WHO), RotaryInternational, the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and UNICEF - issued a statement applauding the political engagement of G8 leaders and officials to keep up momentum on all actions needed to achieve a polio-free world. The initiative also emphasized that it looks forward to working closely with the G8 and other donors to identify additional sources of funding to scale up immunization activities in west and central Africa.

The goal of the Polio Eradication Initiative, the world's largest public-private sector partnership, is to interrupt wild poliovirus transmission globally by the end of 2004. The number of polio-endemic countries has been reduced from 125 when the initiative was launched in 1988, to six, and the number of annual cases of polio has dropped from 350,000 in 1988 to 784 last year.

Rotary's four founders to be honored throughout U.S. in July

Events throughout U.S. will recognize the roles that each of the founding members of Rotary contributed to the creation and early development of the Rotary movement.

Paul P. Harris (1868-1947) was a Chicago attorney in 1905 when he had an idea for a club in which professionals could share "mutual cooperation and informal friendship such as all of us had once known in our villages."

Silvester Schiele (1870-1945) was a coal dealer and a client of Paul Harris in 1905. During the course of their business dealings, Harris first shared the idea with Schiele for a new kind of club for professionals. Gustavus H. "Gus" Loehr (1864-1918) was a Chicago mining engineer who lent his office on the seventh floor of the Unity Building at 127 Dearborn Street in Chicago for the first gathering, of the founders of Rotary on 23 February 1905. Hiram E. Shorey (1862-1944) was a merchant tailor in 1905. One of the founding four members of the Rotary Club of Chicago, he remained a Rotarian for only a short time before moving back to his home state.

Chicago Rotarians dedicate spot where Rotary began

On 17 June, the Rotary Club of Chicago, Illinois, USA, dedicated a sidewalk plaque marking the sidewalk space where the Rotary movement was born nearly 100 years ago. Although the Unity Building was demolished in 1989, the contents of Room 711, Loehr's office in the Unity Building where the first meeting took place, were carefully relocated to RI headquarters in Evanston, Illinois, before demolition of the building began in 1989.

Joining Chicago Rotarians at the dedication were RI President Jonathan Majiyagbe, President-elect Glenn E. Estess Sr., 2005-06 President Carl-Wilhelm Stenhammar, along with numerous past district governors and past presidents of the Rotary Club of Chicago.

The plaque will be an important marker for Rotarians visiting Chicago for the RI Centennial Convention in June 2005.
