They were highly concerned and responded to our request immediately. As soon as the requirement of school benches was hosted on the net, they raised the funds and joined hands with our club to execute this project of handing over school benches to the underprivileged children of ZPH School, Peddakandukur and Yadagiripalli.

Our club team worked hard to get the lowest quotation and executed the project in eight months. *The benches were procured from the funds received from Rotary club of POZNAN PUSZCZYKKOWO of Poland and funds of R.C.S.S.* 

The first lot of 35 benches was handed over to high school at ZPH School, Yadgiripalli on 15<sup>th</sup> August '07. Class rooms were inaugurated by Rtn.IPDG Samba Siva Rao, Rtn. Rajesh Pamnani & Rtn. Kailash Gupta.







The function was presided over by Mr.Malleshan, Head Master. Local leaders including Sarpanch participated. Mr.Malleshan and local leaders profusely thanked Rotarians for their generosity and service.

Further a medical camp was organized at Z.P.H. School, Yadagiripalli, on 18<sup>th</sup> November, 2007 from 09.00 am to 01.00 pm. Eminent Doctor, Dr.L.R.Surender-Dentist, Dr.Kiran Kumar-Pediatrician, Dr.Simon-Ophthalmologist, examined 270 students and advised them about dental health, general health and eye problems.

Biscuits and medicines were distributed free.

The handing over of second lot of 29 benches to the primary school of Z.P.H. School was done amongst the presence of G.S.E. Team leader and his group Denis Devor, Mickel, Troy, Amy and Amanda from Colorado, U.S.A. with grand fanfare.

The local leaders and school authorities highly appreciated our efforts and contribution to the school children, whose eyes dazzled and beamed with happiness by looking at the new school benches and desks. Their urge to use the proper place to study and write was well written on their innocent faces.
